

MINOR IN INDIGENOUS STUDIES

Who can Minor in Indigenous Studies?

Students in the Bachelor of Arts (BA), Bachelor of Science (BSc), or Bachelor of Arts and Science (BASc) program may declare a minor in Indigenous Studies, to be completed in addition to their major.

The opportunity to declare a minor in Indigenous Studies is also available for following majors:

- Single discipline majors.
- General Major in the Humanities.
- General Major in the Sciences.
- General Major in the Social Sciences.
- Multidisciplinary majors.

A minor in Indigenous Studies is NOT available to Indigenous Studies majors, or if Indigenous Studies is chosen as one of the disciplinary streams in the General Major in the Humanities or the General Major in the Social Sciences.

Requirements:

Students must complete a minimum of six courses in Indigenous Studies.

- No more than one Independent Study or Applied Studies course may be counted towards the minor.
- Students who have completed Indigenous Studies 1000 as required for their major may complete an alternate Indigenous Studies course for their minor.

For students who complete the required six Indigenous Studies courses, the minor in Indigenous Studies will be acknowledged on the official transcript.
