NSERC also announced recipients of its graduate scholarships and fellowship awards. Mark Hornsby, Biological Sciences and a PhD candidate, received a graduate scholarship. NSERC grants aim to develop, attract and retain the world's most talented researchers at Canadian universities who are working in a multitude of scientific and engineering disciplines.


