Fox was a United States Marine from 1999-2007 and was deployed during Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom in 2003. He also served as a police officer with Blood Tribe Police Service and other police agencies.

Fox has received several awards due to his leadership skills, extensive training and work experience. Additionally, he has received the rights to conduct capturing ceremonies for a headdress transfer and to paint horses for other ceremonies. He currently works for the Blood Tribe and owns/operates a catering/security company.

Recently, JR Fox was the individual who captured Dr. Digvir Jayas, for the Headdress transfer ceremony during the presidential installation.
