


<p>Based on the true story of a French Resistance fighter imprisoned by the Nazis, Bresson constructs a subtle, detailed film of suspense. A genre-defining film.</p>	<p>Thurs Sep 22</p>	
<p>2. Vivir es fácil con los ojos cerrados (Living is Easy with Eyes Closed) Spain, Dir. David Trueba, 2013</p>	<p>Wed Sep 28</p>

<p>An accountant turns his humdrum life upside down when he secretly takes up ballroom dancing in order to meet the beautiful dance instructor.</p>	<p>Thurs Oct 20</p>	
<p>4. Copie conforme (Certified Copy) Iran-France-Italy-Belgium, Dir. Abbas Kiarostami, 2010</p>	<p>Wed Oct 26</p>	
<p>On a trip to Italy to promote his book, a British art critic escapes for a day-trip with an attractive antiques dealer, and the two begin to question the meaning of authenticity.</p>	<p>Thurs Nov 3</p>	
<p>5. La Rafle (The Round Up) France, Dir. Roselyne Bosch, 2010</p>	<p>Thurs Nov 17</p>	
<p>"La Rafle" refers to the French Vichy government's round-up and deportation of 13,000 Jews in July of 1942. The film is based on true events and follows the internment, and unlikely escape, of two young boys.</p>	<p>Wed Nov 23</p>	
<p>6. Sin nombre ("Nameless") Mexico-U.S., Dir. Cary Fukunaga, 2009</p>	<p>Thurs Dec 1</p>	
<p>Honduran teenager Sayra is reunited with her father, and with him sets out to escape to America. But their encounter with a young Mexican gang member on the run changes the course of events.</p>	<p>Wed Dec. 7</p>
