About the Post-Diploma Bachelor of Nursing Program

The Post-Diploma Bachelor of Nursing (B.N.) program includes both professional Nursing and liberal education courses. The professional courses include studies in the foundations of nursing, its practice, and the expansion of its knowledge. The professional program is built upon a sound liberal education foundation including courses from the areas of Fine Arts and Humanities, Social Sciences, and Science.

General Liberal Education Requirement

The General Liberal Education Requirement is a degree requirement for all University of Lethbridge undergraduate students. It is based on the liberal education philosophy of the University and is designed to ensure that students acquire breadth of knowledge encompassing a wide range of disciplines.

Registered Nurses

Students who hold licensure as Registered Nurses may complete the Bachelor of Nursing program in one year or 12 consecutive months.

Full- and Part-time Studies

The Faculty of Health Sciences aims to make the Post-Diploma Bachelor of Nursing (B.N.) degree program accessible to full-time and part-time students. Students are required to plan their entire program with an Academic Advisor (tel. 403-329-2220) as soon as they are accepted into the program.

Minimum GPA Requirements

Students must attain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 for all courses and 2.50 for required Nursing and Health Sciences courses taken at the University of Lethbridge for credit toward the B.N. degree. All courses must be completed within six years of the first Nursing course used for credit toward the degree.
