 - a minimum grade point average of 2.00 on all Management courses
 - a minimum grade of 'C-' is required in Statistics 1770; Economics 1010 and Economics 1012; Writing 1000 OR a university English course; all Management courses; and all courses marked with an asterisk (*) in the Management Majors section of the 2010/2011 Calendar (see p. 289)
 - 2. The General Liberal Education Requirement (see the 2010/2011 Calendar, p. 85).

B. To qualify for graduation, you must fulfill Arts and Science degree requirements:

- I. The appropriate number of Science (for B.Sc.) or non-Science (for B.A.) courses. See the 2010/2011 Calendar, p. 112, Divisional Course Designation, and p. 85, General Liberal Education Requirement for Lists I and II (non-Science) and List III (Science):
 - _____ For the B.A., at least 20 non-Science courses (see Lists I and II)
 - For the B.Sc., at least 20 Science courses (see List III)

D. To qualify for graduation, you must also fulfill the University of Lethbridge Residence Requirement and meet the Time Limit of the Faculty of Management:

- I. For the B.A./B.Mgt. or the B.Sc./B.Mgt., 30 courses completed at the University of Lethbridge, including 20 Arts and Science courses and 10 Management courses at the 3000/4000 level.
- 2. For Management, all degree requirements must be completed within 10 years after admission to the Faculty.

*For purposes of these regulations, Mathematics and Computer Science; Geography and Archaeology; and French, German, and Spanish may be considered as separate departments.
 Note: Students seeking the B.A./B.Mgt. or B.Sc./B.Mgt. degrees may not declare similar majors. For example, if Economics, Native American Studies, or Political Science is chosen for the B.A. portion of the B.A./B.Mgt. program, Economics, First Nations' Governance, or Political Science respectively must be excluded from the list of B.Mgt. majors.
