About the First Nations' Governance Minor A minor in First Nations' Governance is available as an adjunct to all majors, except First Nations' Governance, in the Bachelor of Management degree, Post-Diploma Bachelor of Management degree, Professional Diploma in Accounting, Management Certificate, B.Mgt/B.Ed., Post-Diploma B.Mgt/B.Ed., and second degrees in Management. In some cases, achievement of the minor and a chosen major will require a student to take extra courses. For students who complete all the requirements, the minor in First Nations' Governance will be acknowledged on the official transcript (see Part 11 - Faculty of Management in the 2012/2013 Calendar).
