_____ Not more than four Activity courses (i.e. courses labelled PHAC and MUSE; maximum 6.0 credit hours) may be completed for credit towards the degree, except for Kinesiology majors (not more than 10 Activity courses; 15.0 credit hours) and Music majors (not more than 8 Activity courses; 12.0 credit hours).

_____ Not more than four courses (12.0 credit hours) from disciplines offered outside the Faculty of Arts and Science or the Faculty of Fine Arts may be completed for credit towards the degree (i.e. labelled CDEV, CRED, EDUC, HLSC, MGT, NURS, and PUBH). Courses cross-listed between the Faculty of Arts and Science and another Faculty do not count towards this limit.

_____ **Residence requirement:**
