Admission	A student may gain admission to the Post-Diploma Bachelor of Management Degree program by completing an approved diploma in business administration or management with a cumulative program grade point average (GPA) at or above the current admission cut-off. Admission is guaranteed at 3.00 and above.			
Management Minors	The Faculty of Management offers minors in First Nations' Governance, Information Systems*, International Management, New Media, Population Health, Social Responsibility, and Supply Chain Management. In some cases, achievement of the minor and a chosen major will require a student to take extra courses. Students may not declare a minor in the same subject as their major. For students who complete all the requirements, the minor will be acknowledged on the official transcript (see Part 11 - Faculty of Management in the UofL Calendar or the Minor Program Planning Guides available online at www.uleth.ca/ross/program-planning). <i>*The major and minor in Information Systems for Management programs has been suspended, beginning May 1, 2013.</i>			
Duplicated Courses	Students who are admitted to the Post-Diploma Bachelor of Management program cannot receive credit for courses at the University of Lethbridge for which they have equivalent credit in their diplomas. For example, a student with a business diploma who has completed a transferable Human Resource Management course in the diploma cannot take Management 3050/Political Science 3420 - Human Resource Management at the University of Lethbridge for credit. Substitute courses will be assigned by the Faculty of Management to replace any courses for which they have equivalent credit. Substitute courses must be approved by the Faculty of Management. Diploma courses that satisfy Core Requirements must have a minimum grade requirement of 'C-'. Students are strongly encouraged to consult with an academic advisor if they have questions.
