Discipline Content

The Bachelor of Fine Arts (Native American Art) offers a perfect opportunity to immerse yourself in Art. Within the context of a liberal education degree, the program provides the opportunity for intensive instruction in studio production and sustained engagement with the critical, theoretical and historical discourses related to contemporary art practice. Students can major in Art Studio or Art History/Museum Studies, each of which has a Native American art emphasis.

Portfolio Requirements

Students applying for the Art Studio major must submit a portfolio. Portfolio requirements can be found on p. 174 of the 2014/2015 University of Lethbridge Calendar and at www.uleth.ca/finearts/departments/art/admissions.

Courses

B.F.A. (Native American Art) students must take Art History/Museum Studies 1000 - Introduction to Art, Art History/Museum Studies 2001 - Contemporary Art Practices and Theories, Art History/Museum Studies 2225 - Western Art from Prehistory to the French Revolution, Art 2031 - Foundation Studio (Drawing and Image), and Art 2032 - Foundation Studio (Object and Space). These courses provide the basic preparation necessary for all upper-level courses. In their final year of study, Art Studio majors take Art 3040 - Advanced Studio and Art 4048 - Senior Studio, providing an opportunity for self-directed work in a supportive peer environment. Courses in Native American Studies are also required to ensure a First Nation's perspective for a deep engagement with First Nation's historical and contemporary issues.

UofL Art Collection

All Art students benefit from first-hand examination of original artworks in the University of Lethbridge Art Collection. One of the most impressive collections of any educational institution in Canada, it includes artwork representing several movements from Canada, America, and Europe spanning the 19th and 20th centuries, and continues to grow with 21st century additions.

Visiting Artist Program

The Visiting Speakers in the Arts Program offered through Art Now and Architecture and Design Now, provides extensive exposure to leading practitioners in the field. With several high-profile visitors every week—including artists, critics, historians, and curators—students have a unique learning experience, one that illuminates national and international achievement.

Career Opportunities

In addition to creating artwork, careers in Art include administrative positions in galleries and museums, design, teaching, art conservation, and art therapy. Many alternatives can also be generated by using elective courses in other disciplines such as New Media, Urban and Regional Studies, Psychology, and Management.

Program Requirements

The B.F.A. (Native American Art) degree requires 40 semester courses, including a minimum of 21 Art and Art History/Museum Studies courses (63.0 credit hours) and 8 Native American Studies courses for Art Studio majors and a minimum of 19 Art and Art History/Museum Studies courses (57.0 credit hours) and 9 Native American Studies courses for Art History/Museum Studies majors.

Transfer Credit

Remember that you may use both University of Lethbridge credit and credit transferred from another college or university to meet degree and major requirements. Transfer credit may be either specified or unspecified. Specified credit is indicated on your transcript by the subject name and the specific number of the course, e.g., Art History/Museum Studies 1000, Art History/Museum Studies 2225, etc. Unspecified credit (1XXX, 2XXX, etc.) is indicated by the subject name and the level of the course in parentheses, e.g., Art History/Museum Studies (1000 level), Art History/Museum Studies (2000 level), etc.

Unspecified Course Credit

Unspecified course credit means that the University of Lethbridge does not offer the same course you transferred in, but we recognize it and treat it as a regular course. An unspecified course would meet an elective requirement in your program, but it could not meet a specific course requirement. For example, if Art History/Museum Studies 2225 is required in your program, you could not use Art History/Museum Studies (2000 level) to fulfill that requirement. Students with unspecified transfer credit need to consult an Academic Advisor to establish how the transfer credit fits in the degree program. This should be done as soon as possible after transfer credit is awarded.

This is a planning guide and not a graduation check or guarantee of course offerings. You should have a program check done in your final year of studies. Students are responsible for the accuracy of their own programs. The guide should be used in conjunction with the University of Lethbridge Calendar, which is the final authority on all questions regarding program requirements and academic regulations.
