### **Minimum Grade Requirement**

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in ECON 1010; ECON 1012; STAT 1770; WRIT 1000 OR a university English course; all Management courses in order to meet degree requirements in the Faculty of Management. The Faculty of Education requires a minimum program grade point average of 2.50 in Education courses and the courses comprising the major.

## 1000-Level Limit

Not more than 10 courses may be taken at the 0100/1000 level for credit toward the degree.

#### **Residence Requirement**

All students must complete at least 30 University of Lethbridge courses, 10 in Management (7 of which must be 3000/4000level) and 15 in Education.

#### Sequencing

Courses in this major may not be offered every semester. Consult timetables and academic advisors

#### **Management Minors**

The Faculty of Management offers minors in First Nations' Governance, Information Systems\*, International Management, New Media, Social Responsibility, and Supply Chain Management. In some cases, achievement of the minor and a chosen major will require a student to take extra courses. Students may not declare a minor in the same subject as their major.For students who complete all the requirements, the minor will be acknowledged on the official transcript (see Part 11 - Faculty of Management in the UofL Calendar or the Minor Program Planning Guides available online at www.uleth.ca/ross/programplanning).

\* The major and minor in Information Systems for Management programs has been suspended, beginning May 1, 2013.

#### Education Minors

The Faculty of Education offers 18 minors (see Part 8 - Faculty of Education in the UofL Calendar). A minor consists of five non-Education courses (excluding those used in the major) and one curriculum and instruction Education course (to be completed after admission to the Faculty of Education). Students may use the same courses to fulfill the minor and the General Liberal Education Requirement (GLER).

## **Education Specializations**

The Faculty of Education offers two specializations: Special/Inclusive Education and Technology in Education. The specializations consist of four courses and a corresponding Professional Semester III focus.

#### **Combined Degrees Program:**

Students begin this program in the Faculty of Management where they progress toward completion of Management degree requirements, and prepare to meet the admission requirements for the Faculty of Education. Please note that completion of the required prerequisites does not guarantee admission to the Faculty of Education. For students of Aboriginal descent, and students with a significant shift in academic performance, please see the current Calendar for the Faculty of Education's admission policy.
