**Prerequisites & Corequisites**

2015/2016 prereqs and coreqs are given in parentheses below each applicable course, but are subject to change. Check prereqs and coreqs in the current Academic Calendar or Timetable for each course before registering.

**Modified General Liberal Education Requirement (GLER)**

7 Arts and Science courses are required and built into the program as follows:

- 3 List I - Fine Arts & Humanities
- 2 List II - Social Science
- 2 List III - Science

**Duplicate Courses**

Students who are admitted to the Post-Diploma B.Mgt./B.Ed. program cannot receive credit for courses at the U of L for which they have equivalent credit in their diplomas. Substitute courses must be approved by the Faculty of Management. Diploma courses that satisfy Core Requirements must have a minimum grade of 'C-'.

**Extra Courses**

Extra courses are assigned where a diploma does not provide the appropriate background for the major chosen. Students who choose a major other than General Management should meet with a Faculty of Management Academic Advisor and may be required to extend their program beyond 35 courses.

**Residence Requirement**

Students must complete at least 30 courses at the U of L, including a minimum of 8 Management courses and 15 Education courses (three Professional Semesters).

**Minimum Grade Requirement**

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in STAT 1770, WRIT 1000 or a university English course; and all Management courses in order to meet degree requirements. However, if a student chooses to meet the Faculty of Education's Writing Proficiency Requirement (WPR) by completing WRIT 1000 or a university English course, a minimum grade of 'B' is required. Students who take ECON 1010 or ECON 1012 as part of their degree requirements at the U of L must achieve a minimum grade of 'C-'.
