About the Post-Diploma B.F.A Dramatic Arts Program	This broad, general-focus program is appropriate for students with a technical or performance diploma in Theatre or Drama. Post-Diploma students study theatre history, acting, stagecraft, and obtain hands-on, practical, experience by participating in the series of major productions presented by the Department of Theatre and Dramatic Arts.		
Portfolio/Audition Requirements	Students declare the major that most closely corresponds to the content of the diploma. All students must provide a portfolio, and an audition is required for the Performance major. Admission requirements can be found on p. 171 of the 2015/2016 University of Lethbridge Calendar and at www.uleth.ca/finearts/departments/drama/theatre-dramatic-arts-admissions.		
Career Opportunities	Graduates are equipped to step confidently into the entertainment industry, graduate studies, or a variety of other professions.

Drama Production Credit	Drama 2600, 3600, and 4600 are courses that allow credit for participation in productions produced by the Department of Theatre and Dramatic Arts. Participation includes all aspects of the production process (acting, design, props, lighting, sound, stage management, etc.). Drama 2611, 3611, and 4611 are similar, but are limited to technical or design assignments. Registration in Drama 2611 requires the corequisite of Drama 2810. Drama 2611 is a prerequisite for Drama 3611 and 4611.		
	Procedure:		
	 The production season is established in the spring of each year. The list is available from the Chair of the Department of Theatre and Dramatic Arts. Students may contact the faculty member responsible for directing the play or watch the bulletin boards for notice of audition dates. Those interested in the technical aspects of the production may wish to contact the Technical Director. Registration in the relevant course number normally occurs in the semester in which the production(s) will be completed. The usual course registration deadlines do not apply; however, if the course is not registered before November 15 for the Fall or March 15 for the Spring, registration will be delayed until the following semester. The forms required to register are available from the Fine Arts Advising Office (W660). Registration is coordinated by the Faculty of Fine Arts Advising Office.

Co-operative Education in the Fine Arts	A Co-op option, requiring three work terms, is available. Program Requirements	Students admitted to the Post-Diploma Bachelor of Fine Arts - Dramatic Arts (After a Two-Year Diploma) are required to complete a minimum of 15 courses, including 8 courses in Drama, at the University of Lethbridge. A grade point average of at least 2.00 must be maintained at all times.		
Course Requirements	All current specified course requirements for the B.F.A Dramatic Arts will apply. Courses from the diploma program may apply. Depending on the content of the diploma presented, students will be required to complete a 15-course subset of the courses required for the four-year degree program.
