# **Prerequisites & Corequisites**

#### **General Liberal Education Requirement (GLER)**

## **1000-Level Limit**

Not more than 12 courses may be taken at the 0100/1000 level for credit toward the degree.

#### **Residence Requirement**

All students must complete at least 20 University of Lethbridge courses, 10 of which must be 3000/4000-level Management courses. Political Science majors can also use 3000/ 4000-level Political Science courses to meet this requirement.

#### **Minimum Grade Requirement**

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in ECON 1010; ECON 1012; STAT 1770; WRIT 1000 OR a university English course; all Management courses; and all courses marked with an asterisk (\*) in order to meet degree requirements.

## **Repeated Courses**

Submit a 'Repeated Course Form' through the Registrar's Office for each repeated course so only the most recent attempt is calculated in the GPA.
