Department of Art

Courses

As part of the required core courses, students will be introduced to art studio areas in a Visual Foundations course and must take studio courses in drawing and computer art. Students will also take courses in art history/museum studies, and further studio areas including drawing, painting, sculpture, printmaking, photo-arts, video, installation art, or audio art. Studio courses will culminate with Advanced Studio and Senior Studio courses. These six-credit-hour Art Studio courses are arranged in concentrated time slots (two five-hour blocks per week) to ensure uninterrupted creative activity.

Portfolio Requirements

Students applying for the B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. must submit a portfolio. Portfolio requirements can be found on p. 174 of the 2016/2017 University of Lethbridge Calendar and at www.uleth.ca/finearts/departments/art/admissions.

U of L Art Collection

All Art students benefit from first-hand examination of original artworks in the University of Lethbridge Art Collection. One of the most impressive collections of any educational institution in Canada, it includes artwork representing several movements from Canada, America, and Europe spanning the 19th and 20th centuries, and continues to grow with 21st century additions.

Visiting Artist Program

The Visiting Speakers in the Arts Program, offered through Art NOW and Architecture and Design NOW, provides extensive exposure to leading practitioners in the field. With several high-profile visitors every week—including artists, critics, historians and curators—students have a unique learning experience, one that illuminates national and international achievement. Course credit is available for attendance in the Visiting Speakers series in Art 3261 - Art NOW, Art 3262 - Art NOW, Art 3210 - Architecture and Design NOW I, and Art 4210 - Architecture and Design NOW II.

Faculty of Education

Education 2500

Education 2500 is an introductory course that must be completed before admission to the program. Its main focus is to assist students in making a decision about the suitability of teaching as a career.

Field Experience

One of the strengths of the University of Lethbridge Education program is the extensive amount of field experience students acquire during their two years in the faculty. Beyond Education 2500, all students teach in the schools during Professional Semesters I (five weeks), II (six weeks), and III (full semester internship). Practicum placements in PS II and PS III focus on teaching art in a variety of classroom contexts, while PS I is a more generic placement.

Studio Practice

Students will experience many different aspects of studio practice ranging from integrating Art across the curriculum from Kindergarten through Grade 12, to teaching Art as a separate discipline. Therefore, it is recommended that students develop strong studio art skills prior to admission to the faculty.

Career Opportunities

Completing a B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. or B.A./B.Ed. Combined Degrees program enables graduates to teach from K to 12. However, the B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. program better equips graduates to teach Grades 7-12, and is especially valuable for teaching Grades 10-12.

This is a planning guide and not a graduation check or guarantee of course offerings. You should have a program check done in your final year of studies. Students are responsible for the accuracy of their own programs. The guide should be used in conjunction with the University of Lethbridge Calendar, which is the final authority on all questions regarding program requirements and academic regulations. Contact an Academic Advisor in the Faculty of Fine Arts or Faculty of Education for advising information.

Teaching in the Practicum Art students commonly teach units on painting, ceramics, drawing, and computers, as well as another subject such as Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, or Language Arts. Therefore, students must be strong and confident in the area of Art to integrate it with other subjects.

Program Requirements The B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. Combined Degrees program requires a minimum of 50 semester courses, including 30 in Fine Arts (and Arts and Science) and 20 in Education. A minimum of 22 Art, Art History, and/or Museum Studies courses (66.0 credit hours). Students begin this program in the Faculty of Fine Arts where they progress toward completion of Fine Arts degree requirements, and prepare to meet the admission requirements for the Faculty of Education. Students admitted to the Faculty of Fine Arts may declare their intention of completing the combined B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. degrees. Such students who have not yet been admitted to the Faculty of Education are designated pre-B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. After completion of the minimum number of courses required to be eligible for admission to the Faculty of Education, students may apply and, if accepted, be formally enrolled in the B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. Combined Degrees program. Students are not officially in the program until they have been admitted to BOTH the Faculty of Fine Arts (through admission to the University) and the Faculty of Education.

Transfer Credit Remember that you may use both University of Lethbridge credit and credit transferred from another college or university to meet degree and major requirements. Transfer credit may be either specified or unspecified. Specified credit is indicated on your transcript by the subject name and the specific number of the course, e.g., Art History 1000, Art History 2225, etc. Unspecified credit (1XXX, 2XXX, etc.) is indicated by the subject name and the level of the course in parentheses, e.g., Art History (1000 level), Art History (2000 level), etc.

Unspecified Course Credit Unspecified course credit means that the University of Lethbridge does not offer the same course you transferred in, but we recognize it and treat it as a regular course. An unspecified course would meet an elective requirement in your program, but it could not meet a specific course requirement. For example, if Art History 2225 is required in your program, you could not use Art History (2000 level) to fulfill that requirement. Students with unspecified transfer credit need to consult an Academic Advisor to establish how the transfer credit fits in the degree program. This should be done as soon as possible after transfer credit is awarded.

Admission to the Faculty of Education

- _____ Completion of a minimum of 20 semester courses (60.0 credit hours).
 Note: Due to course sequencing, the Faculty of Fine Arts strongly encourages students to complete 30 courses prior to applying to the Faculty of Education.
- _____ Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all U of L and transferable courses taken within the semesters containing the last 20 courses (60.0 credit hours). All courses must be graded with the exception of Education 2500.
- _____ Completion of a minimum of eight courses (24.0 credit hours) in Art, Art History, and/or Museum Studies, including all transferable courses, with a minimum cumulative average of 2.50.
- _____ Credit in Education 2500 - Practicum I - Orientation to Teaching (or equivalent) including a favourable recommendation from the instructor.
- _____ Demonstrated proficiency in written and oral English by the decision document deadline (see **Part 1 - Admission, p. 29**). Applicants may meet the Writing Proficiency Requirement in any of the following ways:
 - obtaining a grade of 75 percent or higher on the English Language Arts 30-1 Alberta Diploma exam
 - obtaining a final grade of 80 percent or higher in English Language Arts 30-1 or its equivalent from any province
 - obtaining a grade of 'B' (3.00 on a 4.00 scale) or higher in Writing 1000
 - obtaining a grade of 'B' (3.00 on a 4.00 scale) or higher in a university English course
 - successful completion of a recognized degree from an English-language university

Other Graduation Requirements:

Fine Arts:

- _____ Completion of at least 30 courses (90.0 credit hours) from disciplines offered by the Faculty of Fine Arts or the Faculty of Arts and Science with a grade point average of at least 2.00.
- _____ A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all Art, Art History, and Museum Studies courses.
- _____ Completion of at least eight Art, Art History, and/or Museum Studies courses (24.0 credit hours) at the 3000/4000 level.
- _____ Completion of the General Liberal Education Requirement. A maximum of four courses from one department may be counted toward this requirement. (Please refer to the 2016/2017 Calendar, p. 85, for further details.)
- _____ A maximum of three Independent Study courses in Fine Arts.
- _____ Not more than eight courses at the 0100-1000 level. For 0100-1990 courses that have a 0100/1000 level background or prerequisite, only the first course in the series counts toward this limit.

Education:

- _____ Maintenance of a program grade point average of 2.50 in Education courses.
- _____ Completion of the Art major, as defined by the program, with a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher on the courses comprising the major.
- _____ A maximum of two Independent Study courses in Education.

Residence Requirement:

- _____ Completion of a minimum of 30 courses (90.0 credit hours) at the University of Lethbridge, including a minimum of seven Art, Art History, and/or Museum Studies courses (21.0 credit hours) and 15 Education courses (45.0 credit hours).
