Faculty: Fine Arts/Education

Department of Art

Courses	In the B.F.A. - Art portion of their Combined Degrees program, students are required to complete a subset of the courses required for the five-year Bachelor of Fine Arts - Art/Bachelor of Education.
Portfolio Requirements	Students applying for the Post-Diploma B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. must submit a portfolio. Portfolio requirements can be found on p. 168 of the 2018/2019 University of Lethbridge Calendar and at www.uleth.ca/finearts/departments/art/admissions .
U of L Art Collection	All Art students benefit from first-hand examination of original artworks in the University of Lethbridge Art Collection. One of the most impressive collections of any educational institution in Canada, it includes artwork representing several movements from Canada, America, and Europe spanning the 19th and 20th centuries, and continues to grow with 21st century additions.
Visiting Artist Program	The Visiting Speakers in the Arts Program, offered through Art NOW and Architecture and Design NOW, provides extensive exposure to leading practitioners in the field. With several high-profile visitors every week—including artists, critics, historians and curators—students have a unique learning experience, one that illuminates national and international achievement.

Faculty of Education

Education 2500	Education 2500 is an introductory course that must be completed before admission to the program. Its main focus is to assist students in making a decision about the suitability of teaching as a career.
Field Experience	One of the strengths of the University of Lethbridge Education program is the extensive amount of field experience students acquire during their two years in the faculty. Beyond Education 2500, all students teach in the schools during Professional Semesters I (five weeks), II (six weeks), and III (full semester internship). Practicum placements in PS II and PS III focus on teaching art in a variety of classroom contexts, while PS I is a more generic placement.
Studio Practice	Students will experience many different aspects of studio practice ranging from integrating Art across the curriculum from Kindergarten through Grade 12, to teaching Art as a separate discipline. Therefore, it is recommended that students develop strong studio art skills prior to admission to the faculty.
Career Opportunities	Completing a B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. or B.A./B.Ed. Combined Degrees program enables graduates to teach from K to 12. However, the B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. program better equips graduates to teach Grades 7-12, and is especially valuable for teaching Grades 10-12.
Teaching in the Practicum	Art students commonly teach units on painting, ceramics, drawing, and computers, as well as another subject such as Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, or Language Arts. Therefore, students must be strong and confident in the area of Art to integrate it with other subjects.

Art/Art Education

Post-Diploma B.F.A. - Art/Bachelor of Education

All students begin the program classified as Pre-Post-Diploma B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. in the Faculty of Fine Arts. After the completion of 10 courses, including Education 2500 (or equivalent), students may apply to the Faculty of Education. Students are not officially in the 35-course Post-Diploma Combined Degrees program until they have been admitted to BOTH the Faculty of Fine Arts and the Faculty of Education. Admission Requirements for the Faculty of Fine Arts include:

_____ Completion of an approved* two- or three-year college diploma in Art with a GPA of 2.50.

* *Approved by the Dean of the Faculty of Fine Arts in consultation with representatives from the academic discipline. Approval is dependent upon the college's program containing the courses required for the first two years of the B.F.A. - Art. The college program must include a minimum of 16 courses in Art.*

Admission Requirements for the Faculty of Education include:

_____ Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all U of L and transferable courses taken within the terms containing the last 20 courses (60.0 credit hours). If any part of the diploma falls within the last 20 courses (60.0 credit hours), the entirety of the diploma (i.e., diploma GPA) is considered in the computation. All courses must be graded with the exception of Education 2500.

_____ Minimum of eight courses (24.0 credit hours) in Art, Art History, and/or Museum Studies.

_____ Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all graded courses comprising the major (including all diploma courses).

_____ Credit in Education 2500 - Practicum I - Orientation to Teaching (or equivalent) including a favourable recommendation from the instructor.

Other Graduation Requirements:

Fine Arts:

_____ Approval, in advance, of the entire program by the Academic Advisor in the Faculty of Fine Arts.

_____ Completion of at least 15 courses from disciplines offered by the Faculty of Fine Arts or the Faculty of Arts and Science with a grade point average of at least 2.00.

_____ Completion of at least eight Art and/or Art History/Museum Studies courses (24.0 credit hours) with a grade point average of at least 2.50.

_____ Completion of a modified Liberal Education List Requirement. Social Science and Science courses from the diploma may be used to meet this requirement. A maximum of four courses from one department may be counted toward this requirement. See the 2018/2019 University of Lethbridge Calendar, School of Liberal Education for complete information.

_____ Completion of at least eight courses (24.0 credit hours) at the 3000/4000 level.

_____ A maximum of three Independent Study courses in Fine Arts.

Education:

_____ Maintenance of a program grade point average of 2.50 in Education courses.

_____ Completion of the Art major, as defined by the program, with a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher on the courses comprising the major.

_____ A maximum of two Independent Study courses in Education.

Residence Requirement:

_____ Completion of a minimum of 35 courses (105.0 credit hours) at the University of Lethbridge, including a minimum of eight Art and/or Art History/Museum Studies courses (24.0 credit hours) and 20 Education courses (60.0 credit hours).
