Drama Production Credit

Drama 2600, 3600, and 4600 are courses that allow credit for participation in productions produced by the Department of Drama. Participation includes all performance aspects of the production process. Drama 2611, 3611, and 4611 are similar, but are limited to technical or design assignments. Registration in Drama 2611 requires the corequisite of Drama 2810. Drama 2611 is a prerequisite for Drama 3611 and 4611.

Procedure:

1. The production season is established in the spring of each year. The list is available from the Chair of the Department of Drama.
2. Students may contact the faculty member responsible for directing the play or watch the bulletin boards for notice of audition dates. Those interested in the technical aspects of the production may wish to contact the Technical Director.
3. Registration in the relevant course number normally occurs in the semester in which the production(s) will be completed. The usual course registration deadlines do not apply; however, if the course is not registered before November 15 for the Fall or March 15 for the Spring, registration will be delayed until the following semester.
4. Registration is coordinated by the Faculty of Fine Arts Advising Office.

Program Requirements

The B.F.A. - Dramatic Arts/B.Ed. Combined Degrees program requires a minimum of 50 term courses, including 30 in Fine Arts (and Arts and Science) and 20 in Education. A minimum of 21 courses in Drama is required. Students begin this program in the Faculty of Fine Arts where they progress toward completion of Fine Arts degree requirements, and prepare to meet the admission requirements for the Faculty of Education. Students admitted to the Faculty of Fine Arts may declare their intention of completing the combined B.F.A. - Dramatic Arts/B.Ed. degrees. Such students who have not yet been admitted to the Faculty of Education are designated pre-B.F.A. - Dramatic Arts/B.Ed. After completion of the minimum number of courses required to be eligible for admission to the Faculty of Education, students may apply and, if accepted, be formally enrolled in the B.F.A. - Dramatic Arts/B.Ed. Combined Degrees program. Students are not officially in the program until they have been admitted to BOTH the Faculty of Fine Arts (through admission to the University) and the Faculty of Education.

Transfer Credit

Remember that you may use both University of Lethbridge credit and credit transferred from another college or university to meet degree and major requirements. Transfer credit may be either specified or unspecified. Specified credit is indicated on your transcript by the subject name and the specific number of the course, e.g., Drama 1000, Drama 2130, etc. Unspecified credit (1XXX, 2XXX, etc.) is indicated by the subject name and the level of the course in parentheses, e.g., Drama (1000 level), Drama (2000 level), etc.

Unspecified Course Credit

Unspecified course credit means that the University of Lethbridge does not offer the same course you transferred in, but we recognize it and treat it as a regular course. An unspecified course would meet an elective requirement in your program, but it could not meet a specific course requirement. For example if Drama 2810 is required in your program, you could not use Drama (2000 level) to fulfill that requirement. Students with unspecified transfer credit need to consult an Academic Advisor to establish how the transfer credit fits in the degree program. This should be done as soon as possible after transfer credit is awarded.

Admission to the Faculty of Education

Completion of a minimum of 20 term courses (60.0 credit hours).

Note: Due to course sequencing, the Faculty of Fine Arts strongly encourages students to complete 30 courses prior to applying to the Faculty of Education.

Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all U of L and transferable courses taken within the terms containing the last 20 courses (60.0 credit hours). All courses must be graded with the exception of Education 2500.

Minimum of eight courses (24.0 credit hours) in Dramatic Arts.

Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all graded courses comprising the major, including all transferable courses.

Credit in Education 2500 - Practicum I - Orientation to Teaching (or equivalent) including a favourable recommendation from the instructor.

Other Graduation Requirements:**Fine Arts:**

- Completion of at least 30 courses (90.0 credit hours) from disciplines offered by the Faculty of Fine Arts or the Faculty of Arts and Science with a grade point average of at least 2.00.
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 on all Drama courses.
- Completion of at least 10 Drama courses (30.0 credit hours) at the 3000/4000 level.
- Completion of the Liberal Education List Requirement. A maximum of four courses from one department may be counted toward this requirement. See the 2018/2019 University of Lethbridge Calendar, School of Liberal Education for complete information.
- A maximum of three Independent Study courses in Fine Arts.
- Not more than eight courses at the 0100-1000 level. For 0100-1990 courses that have a 0100/1000 level background or prerequisite, only the first course in the series counts toward this limit.

Education:

- Maintenance of a program grade point average of 2.50 in Education courses.
- Completion of the Drama major, as defined by the program, with a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher on the courses comprising the major.
- A maximum of two Independent Study courses in Education.

Residence Requirement:

- Completion of a minimum of 30 courses at the University of Lethbridge, including 15 Education courses, and 15 courses offered by the Faculty of Fine Arts or the Faculty of Arts and Science, including a minimum of seven courses in Drama.

Sample Sequencing Plan

Shown below is a sample sequence of courses for your degree. If you follow this plan, you should be able to graduate in five years, provided you complete five courses per term. Students who wish to alter this sequence with regard to the specifically listed courses should consult with an Academic Advisor in the Faculty of Fine Arts.
