2. BOARD CHAIR REMARKS

G. Jong reported he attended the following events:

- CUBA Conference in Montreal beginning of May, along with J. Gallais.
- Convocation (presented Board of Governors Teaching Chair to Lisa Doolittle), Chancellor's Dinner, and First Nations', Metis and Inuit (FNMI) Round Dance. Thanks to all Board of Governors members that participated in the Convocation festivities.
- He attended the Lieutenant Governor Distinguished Artists Awards in Lethbridge hosted by the Allied Arts Council and the City of Lethbridge.

3. PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

M. Mahon reported on:

- Universities Canada (formerly AUCC) meetings in Ottawa, and discussed ways to educate the government on key priorities leading into a federal election. Also met with Ian Shugart, Deputy Minister of Employment and Social Development.
- Ahead of the Herd recruitment event was held this past weekend with over 600 new students coming to engage with the UofL early. A. Hakin gave welcome remarks.
- Quilt Canada came to campus last week, which is an example of how important it is to bring community on campus and generate revenue.
- Appreciation reception was held last Friday for senior administration, Administrative Professional Officer's (APOs) and Exempt Support Staff (ESS).
- President's Executive had an excellent report on a draft People Plan and it is hoped that it can be brought forward to the Board in the fall for endorsement.
- A lot of activity on the research front this spring, such as the CFI investment of \$2 million to Dr. Robert Sutherland. Many more exciting announcements on UNews.
- Council of Presidents Meeting in Calgary May 15, with 26 institutions represented.
- Busy week on campus two weeks ago we installed our 13th Chancellor, Janice Varzari on Thursday as part of our Convocation Ceremonies, Alumni Honor Society Event Wednesday, Chancellor's dinner Thursday, and First Nations', Metis and Inuit (FNMI) Round Dance on Friday.
- Long Service/Retirement Awards & Annual Paul Lewis Retirees Luncheon both were held last month. Always a great way to recognize and honor those who have given years of service to the University.
- This is B. Boudreau's last meeting with the Board before he takes on his new role as Interim Dean of the Faculty of Management. Thanks was given to B. Boudreau for his service to the Board as Vice-Provost.
- Along with R. Westlund, he will be giving a presentation to local Mayors & Reeves in Taber later today, which is part of an ongoing exercise educating people on the UofL in an effort to gain support from the community.
- Meeting with new CEO of Economic Development Lethbridge Trevor Lewington later today.
- Canada Mexico Roundtable in Nanaimo week of June 15, focused on First Nations' engagement.
- Trip at the end of the month to Germany, which will provide an opportunity to tour
 examples of regional innovation in that country to lend to our expertise around the
 Destination Project.

5. ITEMS FOR ACTION

5.1. 2015-16 Budget

With the change in the government, we are unsure of what our funding will be until the provincial budget is released. J. Berezan reported that we are going ahead with budgeting for the 1.4 percent reduction that the previous government announced. We are also factoring in not using the previously approved market modifiers in order to balance the budget as it has been indicated that the new Government will reverse that decision. N. Walker added that this budget is being balanced with one-time funds, but that we still have a \$2.4 million continuing deficit that we have not accounted for.

Thanks was given to N. Walker and her team for the work they have done the past few months in regards to the budget.

5.2. 2014-15 Annual Report
