4153.1 <u>Draft Report of the University Budget Committee 2006-07 to 2009-10 University Budget</u>
Nancy Walker introduced Karen Clearwater, Associate Vice-President
(Financial Planning), and Chair of the Budget Committee.

Karen Clearwater reviewed the Budget and pointed out the new initiatives for the next three years. A detailed description is filed with these minutes.

Rene Boere inquired on funding for items such as Chinook Scholarships and Undergraduate Research Grants. Karen noted that funding for these types of things have never been requested in the past. Nancy Walker explained that a report has been done which shows all the funding for various scholarships and grants. Nancy agreed to provide this report for information.

It was requested that the letters FTE be included somewhere on the Faculty Staffing Plans 2006-07 to 2009-10 on Page 16 of the report for clarification.

Tom Johnston requested that the \$50,000 for an academic development fund for the new Vice-President under point VIII. One Time Allocations, be explained. Seamus O'Shea clarified that this money is used for things such as program reviews, speaker funding, and Teaching Development Funds.

4155.0 OTHER BUSINESS

Seamus O'Shea described the recent Lethbridge Herald article showing the increasing number of students leaving high school before completion, particularly in Alberta which has the lowest number of students graduating from high school in the country.

Seamus explained that the University of Lethbridge has seen a decrease not only in high school students and mature students, but transfer students as well. Seamus stressed the importance of planning recruitment strategies in the next few years, and the importance of working with the colleges and schools to remain competitive. Seamus noted that there may be opportunities to increase programs at the University, mostly in the areas of public health and environmental science.

Bill Cade mentioned that he is currently working with the Chinook Health Region with plans in the case of a pandemic.
