3971.1 <u>Native Student Advisor</u>

3971.7 Bill 43

In a phone call conversation with the Minister information regarding Bill 43 was provided. Bill 43 should become Act 43 prior to Christmas. The University is voicing their concern regarding the structure of Campus Alberta Board on Accreditation. It will be changed to Campus Alberta Quality Council. The UofL has asked that assurance be given as to the quality of new degree programs. It seems to be a peer council which will be charged with quality assurance. Procedures and regulations still need to be put into place.

The Minister has met with student bodies regarding the tuition cap. It will remain in legislation with a tuition cap at 30%.

Changes will be made for representation to the Board of Governors. GFC will be asked to make one faculty appointment and the faculty association will be asked to make another one (can not be President).

There is a clause for no strikes or lockouts.

The University is no longer able to condemn your home or appropriate your home.

General Faculties Council remains unchanged.

The powers and duties are as follows:

- i) The Committee shall be governed by the following principles, according to which both admissions of persons to the University as students and transfer credit evaluation are managed:
- Academic excellence
- Potential for success in pursuit of academic excellence
- Identification and consideration of applicants or groups of applicants with special needs or characteristics, who evidence the potential for success in the pursuit of academic studies
- Fairness, consistency and appropriateness of transfer credit evaluation.

- ii) By delegation from Council, to decide on changes in Admission policies, including those reflecting grades, and to report to Council prior to implementation.
- iii) By delegation from Council, to decide on changes in credit transfer policies, whether across the University or from another institution, and to report to Council prior to implementation.
- iv) To make decisions regarding the admission of students under these principles in the light of institutional capacities, resources, and other factors which may be appropriate to consider.
- v) To make decisions regarding transfer evaluation in a manner consistent with these principles.
- vi) To serve as a policy and advisory body for the Vice-President (Academic) for matters relating to the Private Colleges Accreditation Board and the Campus Alberta Quality Council.
- vii) To report to Council as required but not less than once a year.

The Registrar shall be responsible for appointing a Secretary to the Committee.
