3. **REPORTS**

3.1 Chancellor

- February. C. Horbachewski and the Advancement Office were instrumental in the whole event taking shape. A. Hakin, along with his family, led the science-related activities. Many positive comments have been received.
- In conjunction with the City and the College, the UofL will be hosting the Canada Wide Science Fair in May. It is expected that over 400 high school students will attend.
- In February, the UofL received a gift from BMO of artwork valued at \$1.4 million. It is an important collection as it symbolizes the First Nations community.
- Work is being done to collaborate with various Mexican institutions regarding indigenous education practices.
- The Meet Mike event in March went great and the students were very enthusiastic
- It is very important to remember that although the current budget situation
 will be a challenge going forward, the University of Lethbridge has been
 here for more than 45 years and will continue to be here in the future.
 Despite the significant budget-reduction decision that will have to be made,
 there will continue to be teaching and learning on campus.

Following his report, M. Mahon, along with A. Hakin, gave an update on the budget process. Discussion occurred on the budget regarding collaboration, accessibility, Campus Alberta and messaging. S. McClellan added that we need to put trust in the University's leadership as we are in good hands.

In the fall, Senate changed the name of the award and the terms of the award which we think have increased the nominations received. Thanks were given to S. Olson for all her work.
