457.4 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Budget continues to be an issue for the University. A letter has been received indicating the Government grant will be the same or less for next year. The Alberta Heritage Foundation for Medical Research (AHFMR) appears to be withdrawing from supporting faculty wages and will focus on research support. Budget units will make their presentations to the Budget Committee shortly. It is conceivable budget will not be ratified by the Board of Governors on schedule, since the amount of the Government grant is unknown.

Ashley MacDonald, an award winning Rugby Player, broke her leg before she could compete in Nationals.

GFC members were encouraged to attend a major announcement on Thursday, December 17th, 2009 in the Atrium.

The President extended congratulations to University of Lethbridge Chemistry/Biochemistry and Neuroscience students who returned as gold medalists from a recent international genetically-engineered machines (iGEM) conference at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) in Boston, MA.

The iGEM competition is regarded as the premier undergraduate synthetic biology competition in the World. Student teams are given a kit of biological parts – called BioBricks – at the beginning of the summer from the Registry of Standard Biological Parts. Working at their own schools, they use these parts, along with new parts of their own design, to build biological systems. They then operate these systems on living cells.

There was considerable discussion related to recommendation #99 the expansion of time-frame during which students may designate a course credit/non-credit. It was pointed out that the recommendation was approved by the Associate Deans and academic advising offices. The view was expressed that the opportunity to declare credit/non-credit should not be any sooner than deadline to withdraw from a course. It was clarified that students cannot declare credit/non-credit in their major. A GFC member cautioned that some institutions view a designation of "credit" as a "D" grade, which might disadvantage students entering graduate school.

The pros and cons of eliminating the limit of individual course withdrawals as referred to in Recommendation #97 were discussed. The previous limit of five course withdrawals was selected since that is equivalent to a semester of courses. Concern was expressed that eliminating the withdrawal limit could lead to unsatisfied demand in classes that have empty seats due to withdrawals. The view was expressed that students do not frivolously withdraw and this is a reasonable Recommendation and the right thing to do at this time. It was clarified that this Recommendation does not alter the Withdrawal for Cause (WC) designation. There was some feeling that there should be a mechanism for students who are seeking withdrawal to get academic advising.
