3839.0 PRESIDENT=S REPORT

3839.1 Students= Union Council

President Cade welcomed the new Students= Union President, Matthew McHugh, to General Faculties Council. Matthew McHugh introduced Anna Chu, the Vice-President (Administration) of the Students= Union. Terry Jackson, the Vice-President (Academic) will be a member of General Faculties Council in the next year.

3839.2 Education Budget

President Cade, Vice-President (Academic) O=Shea and Vice-President (Finance and Administration) Walker listened to the Education Budget by Minister Oberg.

Nancy Walker reported that there has been additional money received two weeks ago as a result of the proposal submitted for Faculty attraction and retention. In general, the Operating Grants for the institution increased by \$27 m for all post secondary education institutions. Of this money, \$28 m is provided for Faculty attraction and retention and that will grow to \$41 million by 2003/04. The Access Fund has grown by \$16 million supporting 1200 new entry spaces. In general, the Alberta Learning has increased by 7.7% over the 2000 base year. The Loan Remissions Program will see \$70 m. There is a new Graduate Student Merit Scholarship that will assist 1,000 students with awards of \$2,000 each. Over 1500 students in the 3rd year will be eligible for the Jason Lang Scholarship which will be \$1000 each. There is a \$1.4 m increase in the Jimmy Condon Athletic Award Scholarship and they range from \$1000 to \$1800 for the 1700 students participating in university sports teams. The Heritage Scholarship rose \$2.4 m.

Seamus O=Shea explained that the additional money used for Faculty attraction and retention is now distributed over all universities and colleges.

3839.3 ACCESS Funding

Seamus O=Shea reported that the Vice Presidents and Deans of Management in the three Alberta Universities met with the Department of Learning and negotiated with them a common agreement.

3839.4 Athletics

President Cade reported that Dave Crook has now left for Winnipeg. The Hall of Fame has seen its first inductee, Gary Bowie, for the work done in building athletics at the University.

3839.5 University Successes

The Lethbridge Herald has profiled Joy Morris. She has been successful in her NSERC application. In SSHRC, Peter McCormick has received the first of a three year award as well as Goldie Morgentaler and Kent Peacock. Judith Kulig has been successful in receiving \$600,000 to conduct a survey on rural and remote nursing and what attracts people to the profession. Lisa Doolittle, along with a colleague, won the 4th Annual Gertrude Lippincott for the best article in dance in 2000.

Asia Nelson graduated with an English Degree with great distinction and was named the television host for a new show on a live network called AMy Global

Adventures@.

3839.6 Mexican MBA Scholarship Program

The Mexican MBA Scholarship Program offered by the Faculty of Management in Partnership with University in Mexico City (IPADE), has now been increased to five scholarships. They will be offered to U of L graduates to study at IPADE.

3839.7 Agriculture

The 4H Foundation of Alberta and Alberta Agriculture have recently brought a new scholarship program to provide up to twelve scholarships valued at \$3,500 each.
