4208.0 **ITEMS ARISING FROM MINUTES**

4208.1 **Senior Administration Search**

Two search committees will be meeting this week, one for Dean of Fine Arts and one for University Librarian. Libby Dybikowski from Provence Consulting Ltd. is

working with the University on these searches.

4208.2 Water Building

The University has received \$10 million for the Alberta Water and Environmental Science Building. The announcement was made on October 31, 2007 by Minister

Doug Horner.

4208.3 Whoop Up Drive Intersection

Bill Cade had reported earlier that he had written to the Mayor and the Mayor has responded by detailing the corrections that will be made to the intersection to ensure the safety of our employees and students walking to campus.

4209.0 **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

4209.1 Marlene Stallard

Bill Cade informed Council that Marlene Stallard, the wife of James Stallard, a Calgary campus instructor passed away on November 3, 2007. A memorial service will be held on Friday, November 9.

A moment of silence was observed.

4209.2 Markin Hall

A rather significant announcement took place on October 25 when Minister Doug Horner announced \$50 million for construction of Markin Hall to house the School of Health Sciences and the Faculty of Management. It adds more space and is a transformational investment that brings the two groups together to produce better managers of our health care system. It should be open in 2010. A presentation on Markin Hall will be given by Andy Hakin and Nancy Walker later in today's meeting.

4209.3 University Hall Upgrades

On the same day of the Markin Hall announcement, Minister Horner also announced \$18.415 million for upgrades to University Hall. Bill Cade commented on what a fantastic year it has been, beginning with the \$8 million dollar Prentice donation and culminating with nearly \$80 million from the provincial government announced last month.

4209.4 Women's Rugby is Number 1

Bill Cade mentioned how wonderful it was that the Women's Rugby Team has won a National Championship in our 40th Year. The Women's Pronghorn rugby team captured the Monilex Trophy and are CIS Champions after defeating the host and OUA Champion Western Mustangs, 15-10 in the CIS Championship game in London, Ontario. The Horns had made two previous appearances at the CIS Championships and with the gold medal this year, complete the medal set after winning Silver in 2003 and Bronze last year in London.

4209.5 Trevor Harrison

Trevor Harrison, Chair of Department of Sociology has agreed to serve as the Interim Director of the Prentice Institute. John Prentice had established the Prentice Institute to study long-term challenges of the demographic economic and social issues related to change in world population patterns. Trevor has said that he is willing to help shape the institute in its first two years. There will also be a staff support person hired. We are getting closer to launching the Prentice Institute. One of the key features to the Prentice Institute will be an academic advisory body drawn from the social sciences

and the Faculty of Arts and Science.

4209.6 **Day Care**

The students overwhelmingly passed the referendum on daycare. That means that the Administration will request authority from the Board of Governors to send out a Request for Proposals for a private operator. Bill Cade congratulated Kelly Kennedy and the Students' Union on supporting the daycare. If all goes well and as planned the anticipated opening will be in 2009.

4209.7 **Donor Recognition**

Thursday, November 22, 2007 will be our annual Donor Recognition Night. It will be the day that we announce the end of our capital campaign. Bill Cade mentioned that the success of the capital campaign is because of many groups on campus. The President acknowledged the Chinook Prize, a new award by the Department of Chemistry and Bio-Chemistry that had unprecedented 100% participation by Faculty and staff in that department.

4209.8 Faculty and Media Relations

Bill Cade mentioned that he and Steve Ferzacca of ULFA have talked to the Canadian Association of University Teachers (CAUT) to arrange for faculty media training and guidance on speaking with the media. The University is exploring with Canadian Universities Reciprocal Insurance Exchange (CURIE) the types of coverage they would provide for a faculty exercising academic freedom in speaking. Faculty was asked to watch for the media training sessions. Bill Cade mentioned that faculty could put themselves at risk if they speak ad hominen.

4209.9 U of L Singers

The 14th Annual Festival of Art and Song took place on November 2, 2007. The theme was East Coast Kitchen and included a tribute to George Evelyn who will be retiring this year.

4209.10 **YouTube**

Bill Cade mentioned that the SU President and his team have created a well-done video that is on YouTube. To find the video type in ULSU on the YouTube website search.

4209.11 **40th Anniversary Homecoming**

The Homecoming weekend went very well. Bill Cade commented on dropping the puck at the Men's Pronghorn hockey game and that it was his first time on a very slippery ice surface. Bill Cade also mentioned how much he enjoyed hearing stories from people who were involved in the University 40 plus years ago and about the early years of the University, especially the story about how Arthur Erickson was shot at when he was walking the coulees one day pondering the placement of University Hall. The President will be meeting with Arthur Erickson next week and will ask Mr. Erickson about his experience.

Bill Cade opened the floor for questions.

4210.0 **QUESTIONS**

- University Hall there was a question on what the \$18 million would be used for on University Hall. A large portion will be used for fixing windows, doors, caulking and exterior maintenance.
- Convocation it was said that convocation was a spectacular success and compliments were given to the Convocation Committee.
- Passing with Distinction and Great Distinction Ian MacLachlan questioned the high percentage of Graduates passing with distinction and great distinction from the School of Heath Sciences. Chris Hosgood explained that 12 experienced nurses were put through a unique program to fast track their Bachelor of Nursing in conjunction with the Province of Alberta and since they were such experienced nurses they did extremely well, with 10 of the 12 passing with distinction or great distinction. Dean O'Dea also mentioned that it is extremely difficult to be accepted into the Faculty of Education and that means that the accepted students are the top students and high achievers. So therefore, a higher number of Faculty of Education students pass with distinction or great distinction.

Leslie Lavers added that the standards for graduating with distinction and great distinction are quite similar in all faculties.
