# 4101.1 <u>Associate Vice-President (Academic) Appointment</u>

A letter was recently received from The Honourable David Hancock, Minister of Advanced Education. The letter was to inform the Post-Secondary Institutions that the 7% reduction given to students for tuitions for the Centennial Year may not be able to be put into the base budget.

Arts & Science: B.A. and B.Sc. Rural and Urban Planning and Design Program.

Management: Expansion of the undergraduate program, Graduate.

Education: Modest increase in undergraduate program, Graduate program –

focus on specific school-based counseling.

Graduate Studies: Because Universities have agreed to press Advanced Education for

more grad spaces, looking at additional funding for MA/MSc and

Ph.D. programs.

#### 4101.14 New Classroom

The renovated portion of the Physical Education building will house the new auditorium style classroom with space for 300 students. The use of this room will be monitored to keep with the small class sizes as much as possible.

# 4101.15 International Student Breakfast

The Senate recently hosted the first ever International Student Breakfast. This event is meant to welcome our international students to campus. There are currently 650 international students at the University of Lethbridge.
