Nordic Pole Walking, or Urban Pole Walking, is a low-impact cardio exercise that increases calories burned, uses up to 90 per cent of muscles, reduces stress on hips and knees and more. Elizabeth Sutton, a physiotherapist at Peak Physical Therapy, will introduce the technique and explain the benefits during a 15- to 20-minute talk.
