University of Lethbridge to honour benefactor Bob Dhillon at annual Scholarship Dinner

The University of Lethbridge's Dhillon School of Business will celebrate its 31st Annual Scholarship Dinner on Friday, Apr. 13 at 6 p.m. at the Coast Hotel and Conference Centre by honouring Navjeet (Bob) Dhillon.

Dhillon, the president and CEO of Mainstreet Equity Corp., recently pledged a \$10-million gift to the University, transforming the Faculty of Management to the Dhillon School of Business. The Scholarship Dinner, through the Dhillon School of Business and its advisory board, annually recognizes the contributions and citizenry of an outstanding member or members of the southern Alberta community.

Over the first 30 years of the Scholarship Dinner, more than \$1.5 million has been raised in support of student scholarships. Friday's event will celebrate the contributions of Mr. Dhillon, raise further funds for student scholarships and highlight the transformation of the Dhillon School of Business, the future of finance and business education at the University of Lethbridge.
