Minimum Qualifications:

Park Communicator: High school diploma and one year of related experience (e.g. work in the natural sciences, teaching, communications, performing arts, etc).

Park Interpreter: Two-year post-secondary or equivalent in a related field (natural sciences, education, communications, history, performing arts, etc).

Equivalences will be considered on directly related experience or education considered on the basis of: one year of experience for one year of education or one year of education for one year of experience.

The following are considered assets and should be highlighted:

Written and verbal communications, audience engagement, teaching, acting, singing,

knowledge of Alberta flora and fauna, and outdoor recreational activities.

Successful applicants must have or obtain by May 1st, 2018:

- Class 5-*Full* Licence for *all* Parks, Class 4 (Small Bus Licence) for positions at Dinosaur & Cypress Hills
- Defensive Driving Certificate, current driver's abstract
- First Aid Certificate and Criminal records Check (Note: Must be received by March 15th)
