Position Purpose:

Under the guidance of the Counselling Coordinator, and Head Counsellors, Camp Counsellors work in a 1:3 staff to camper ratio, leading camp activities, supporting campers and camper behavior. Counsellors will also be responsible for the general safety and development, growth, and skill achievement of the campers in his/her group. Camp Counsellors are expected to maintain open lines of communication and work in a cooperative manner with other Camp Counsellors and Leadership Staff in fulfilling roles and duties. At all times, the Camp Counsellor serves as a role model for appropriate social skills and serves as a Social Coach during recreational activities. Two weeks of training and ongoing support will be provided to ensure that the Camp Counsellor has the knowledge and skills for this position. Participate in activities as a role model with appropriate enthusiasm and social skills

Oversee development of campers' abilities and skills in various program activities

Maintain high standards of health and safety in all activities for campers and staff

Assist, as necessary, each assigned camper to meet his/her daily physical and emotional health, hygiene and nutritional needs

Ensure campers and staff follow safety procedures in all program areas

Administer behaviour management strategies in accordance with the camp policies

Program Support (40%)

Assist in the management and care of the physical facilities and equipment in all program areas Check areas and equipment for safety, cleanliness and good repair and report any unsafe conditions immediately

Ensure that program areas are kept free of hazards and debris

Participation

Actively participate with campers in programs and activities

Provide direct leadership during activities and encourage and motivate campers and staff to participate in activities

Provide extra supervision at mealtimes, bedtimes, and any unstructured choice times

Documentation and Communication (20%)

Maintain accurate records in the form of progress notes and reports on an on-going basis Ensure all forms and reports are accurately completed within the guidelines of the camp. This includes incident reports, camper reports, program and training evaluations
