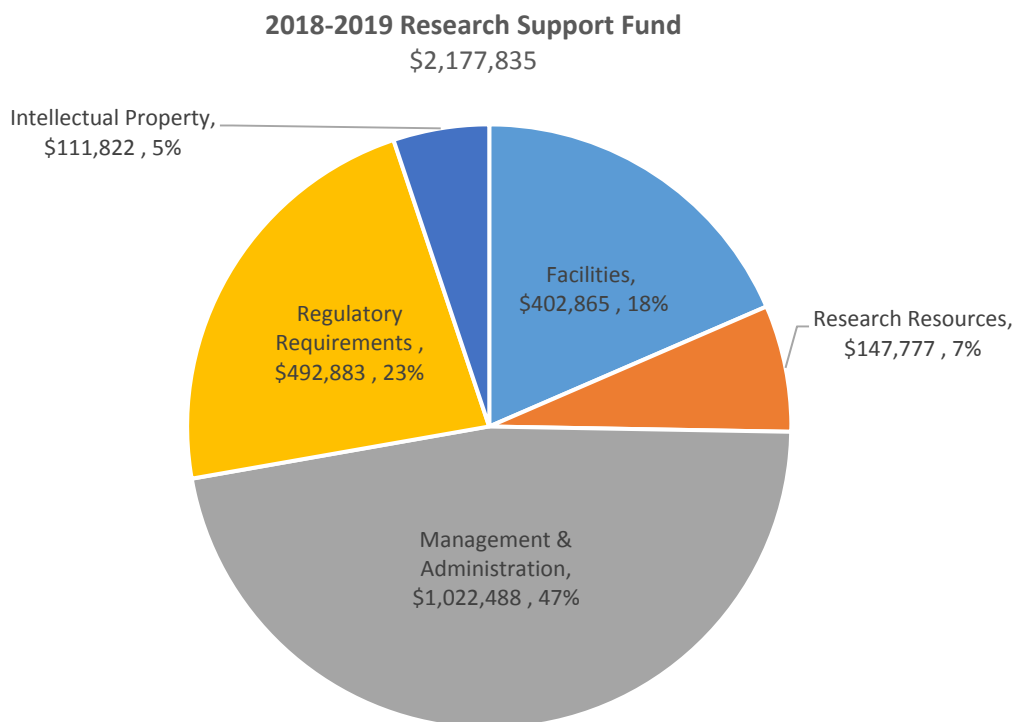


2018-2019 RESEARCH SUPPORT FUND OUTCOMES

ALLOCATION OF FUNDS

The University of Lethbridge received \$2,177,835 in federal Research Support Funding (RSF) in 2018-2019. The following chart provides an overview of how the funds were allocated under each of the five eligible expenditure categories:



- **Facilities:** The funding was used for technician compensation used to support the research facilities, liquid nitrogen used to support research equipment and for facilities management to defray the cost of heat, lighting and electricity for the research space.
- **Resources:** The funding was used to partially fund the cost of electronic journals and databases required by faculty and students and a small portion of the costs associated with insuring research equipment.
- **Management and Administration:** The RSF is critical in maintaining the support infrastructure required for the research enterprise. The staff support the researchers in all aspects of research administration including grant applications, grant administration, reporting, and knowledge requirement compliance requirements.
- **Regulatory requirements:** This area of support has increased significantly over the past few years. There has been a significant investment in animal care and safety training.
- **Intellectual property and commercialization:** This funding was used to fund a position that supports these knowledge mobilization and intellectual property protection
