1. WELCOME

Oki, and welcome to the Senate meeting, being hosted at Kainai High School on the Blood Reserve. Our University's Blackfoot name is Iniskim, meaning Sacred Buffalo Stone. The University of Lethbridge acknowledges and deeply appreciates the Siksikaitsitapii peoples' connection to their traditional territory. We, as people living and benefitting from Blackfoot Confederacy traditional territory, honour the traditions of people who have cared for this land since time immemorial. We recognize the diverse population of Aboriginal peoples who attend the University of Lethbridge and the contributions these Aboriginal peoples have made in shaping and strengthening the University community in the past, present, and in the future.

5. CHANCELLOR'S REMARKS

C. Weaselhead reported on participating in the activities on September 13 during Big Bang Weekend, the grand opening of Science Commons, as well as the launch of the Indigenous Space in the Library 'Our Stories' on September 25. Encouragement was given to members of Senate to attend or volunteer at Fall Convocation on Saturday, October 19, 2019.

6. PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

M. Mahon reported:

- Had a wonderful gathering this morning with faculty, staff and students at Kainai
 High School. Along with the Chancellor, gave a presentation about the symbols we
 have developed as part of convocation to be welcoming of our indigenous students
 as they graduate. New Chief Marshal N. Piquette also participated in the
 presentation and brought along the Convocation mace;
- Big Bang Weekend, the grand opening of Science Commons September 13-14 was a very successful event, with over 3,000 people participating over the two days. It was great to also welcome the Premier and Minister of Advanced Education on campus as well;
- Enrolment has hit record number this year, with a strong growth in both indigenous and international students:

- Hosted our largest new student orientation ever this fall, with over 2000 students (85% of new students) participating;
- Spending much time over the last few months meeting with government with regards to maintaining support for post-secondary institutions within the province in anticipation of the provincial budget being released on October 24. There is speculation that the announcement will result in significant operating grant reductions for post-secondary institutions, especially in light of the MacKinnon report (Blue Ribbon Panel report o Alberta's Finances). We are also awaiting the results of the October 21 federal election;
- Government has indicated that each post-secondary institution is required to adopt a policy around free speech, which needs to be in place before the end of the calendar year. The Provost is leading that process and consultation will begin shortly. An overview will be given at the next Senate meeting;
- In addition to Fall Convocation and Let There be Light Night, Senators are also invited to the Friends of Health Sciences Dinner on October 10 and the Faculty of Arts & Science Scholarship Dinner on October 17.

7. REPORTS

7.1 Board of Governors

A. Hlady highlighted the presentations at the April and June Board meeting and gave thanks to the presenters and organizers of the Board retreat.

7.3 Alumni Association

On behalf of the Alumni Association, J. Elliott highlighted the upcoming Let There be Light Night on October 18, prior to Fall Convocation. Senators are encouraged to attend.

Mahon noted that he, along with the Vice-Presidents, met with the GSA yesterday, and the new executive has lots of interesting ideas, including ways to collaborate with the Students' Union. Kudos was given to both the student groups at looking for those opportunities.

In addition to the report, A. Gammack commented that the four Students' Union Executive members are looking forward to working with fellow Senators this upcoming year.

K. Johnson reported:

• As a follow-up to our April Senate meeting where we received a copy of the book *The Education of Augie Merasty*, as well as had a presentation by Dean Shelly Wismath on the Common Book Project, we are still looking to host a book-club

type event;

- The Get-to-Know-You questionnaire was sent to members this summer and we have received a 50% response rate so far. S. Olson will resend the information, as this will be a great way to find out more information on who are Senators are and the connections outside of the UofL;
- Keep an eye out for information which will be sent out regarding a volunteer opportunity with Operation Red Nose in the lead up to the Christmas holidays;
- We will look at getting a group of Senators together to attend an upcoming Pronghorn event, possibly after the February Senate meeting. More information to come.
