Take Two Speaker Series: Aging Well

Thursday, Jan. 30, 3:30 to 4:30 p.m., Andy's Place, AH100, Anderson Hall

Drs. Jon Doan, a professor in the Department of Kinesiology and Physical Education, and Julia Brassolotto, a professor in the Public Health program in the Faculty of Health Sciences, will discuss their approaches to the concept of aging well. Doan will talk about bridge employment, which is paid full- or part-time work done by adults after the traditional age of retirement. He'll discuss trends in work status, work demands, musculoskeletal discomfort and physical activity among active older Albertans over the past decade. Brassolotto will discuss how sexual expression is often overlooked in continuing care homes, despite evidence of residents' ongoing need for intimacy, connection and self-expression. Currently, no policies or guidelines are in place and Brassolotto will offer some recommendations.
