4. CHANCELLOR'S REMARKS

C. Weaselhead reported on a busy Fall semester:

- Conferred 272 degrees during Fall Convocation on October 17, 2019. The Honourable Paul Martin received an Honorary Doctor of Laws degree, and a luncheon was held following the ceremony in his honour;
- Hosted Chancellor of the University of Alberta Doug Stollery for lunch and a tour of Science Commons on October 23;
- Continued to attend meetings related to the Mastercard Foundation. A funding announcement will take place on December 18, 2019 in Brocket, with more details to come; and
- Continue to receive speaking engagement requests, both related to the University and in the broader community. Upcoming, will be giving a keynote address at the Brooks Rural Mental Health Conference on April 30.

5. PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

M. Mahon reported:

- Attended Team Lethbridge mission to Edmonton last month;
- Hosted a dinner recognizing the accomplishments of 74 Academic All-Canadian Students (those who maintain an 80% average or better). Of those students who represented one-third of our total student athletes), 15 had a 4.0 or better average;
- There are different ways to contribute to Operation Red Nose -- either by using the service or volunteering;
- The Statement on Free Expression will go before the Board for approval on December 12, 2019; and
- There are two searches currently underway Dean, Arts & Science and Associate Vice-President (Research)/Dean, School of Graduate Studies. An announcement for both positions will be made in the coming months.

C. Takeysasu, Associate Vice-President (Finance) gave a presentation on Budget 2019-20, which was given during a University Town Hall meeting on November 28.
