As such, one of Agility's initiatives is to highlight agriculture and agribusiness to U of L students. Reporting to Agility's Program Coordinator, the successful candidate will assist with the implementation, development, promotion, and execution of agriculturally focused programs and directives, with a focus on promoting agribusiness.

The U of L currently houses a Department of Agricultural Studies, a minor in Agricultural Enterprise Management within the Dhillon School of Business, and an Agricultural Student Society. The University of Lethbridge and Lethbridge College also boast a transfer program in Agricultural Enterprise Management where students can transfer from Lethbridge College to any university and earn a degree. In the coming year, a major in Agricultural Enterprise Management will be available for students as well. With the growth of agricultural and agribusiness programming across Lethbridge, Agility will support and develop co-curricular, extra-curricular, and curricular activities to expose students to the opportunities within the agriculture and agribusiness sectors.
