### 4. CHANCELLOR'S REMARKS

C. Weaselhead reported on:

- Similar to the spring, we celebrated Convocation virtually this Fall on October 17 and conferred the degrees of 211students;
- We were very pleased to celebrate with some of our 2020 award recipients at a virtual ceremony on November 25. Congratulations again to 2020 Volunteer Award

Recipient Mary Dyck; and

• Brought greetings and congratulations on behalf of Senate and the Board of Governors at the Long Service and Retiree Recognition virtual celebration on December 3.

## 5. PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

M. Mahon reported on:

- Recently achieved our highest ever Mclean's University ranking;
- Undertaken the challenging work at looking how to move the University forward in a new fiscal framework. There are 21 taskforces looking at all aspects of the university. A consultation committee has also been struck and will look at the taskforce recommendations before they go on to Budget Advisory Committee and President's Executive;
- Communicated messaging on the budget situation through a virtual town hall on October 26;
- A number of initiatives have been undertaken in a effort to aid students, faculty and staff with mental health after an extended break, classes will resume on January 9 instead of the 6; employees are encouraged not to have meetings the week before and after the Christmas break; and additional stress-reducing initiatives will be looked at in the new year;
- Recent appointment of Mike Frank as Director, Indigenous Education & Communications. Mike is an alum and has worked in indigenous governance across Canada;
- Two members of the University of Lethbridge community, T. Whitehead and K. Peterson were recognized last month by the Southern Alberta Chapter of Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP);
- Celebrated the achievements of 84 Academic all Canadians, student athletes who have maintained a grade point average of 80% or higher;
- Accepted position of Chair of COPPOA (Council of post-secondary presidents of Alberta), which includes all 26 post-secondary institutions in the province;
- Recent appointment to the Board of D. Gonci and reappointment of K. Gunn and T. Whitehead;
- Celebrated virtually at recent Awards event on November 25 and Long Service ceremony yesterday; and
- We look forward to a virtual holiday celebration on December 15.
