#### 4. CHANCELLOR'S REMARKS

C. Weaselhead reported that work with the Mastercard Foundation continues forward, with much excitement.

#### 5. PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

M. Mahon reported on:

- Work continues on Fall 2021 planning, with summer 2021 remaining much the same as the spring. Encouragement is being given to students to be back in Lethbridge and on campus this fall. The Calgary Campus is working with Bow Valley College in terms of what the fall semester will look like for our Calgary students;
- COVID Update Work from home still in place; remember Covid protocols, health check when on campus
- Lots of work continues on the University budget, with tough decisions to be made;
- Continued work with government as we help them understand the intricacies of the post-secondary system and recovery post-COVID. We continue to look for Senate support as we advocate for the post-secondary sector in our province;
- Green Shirt Day took place April 7 and the Pronghorn Athletics Blue and Gold Banquet is upcoming;
- Funding updates: Mental Health Grant, Students with Disabilities Grant, Health Workforce Grant are frozen and the Infrastructure Maintenance Grant will be increased to \$7 million:
- Anti-racism messaging equity, diversity and inclusion is key priority for UofL;
- Recent employee announcements: Dena McMartin, Vice-President (Research), Kathy Greenwood, Vice-President (Development & Alumni Relations), Natasha Buis-Deering, Executive Director (Strategic Enrolment Managementt) & Registrar;
- UofL community members who have recently been recognized: YWCA Women
  of Distinction awards Associate Vice-President Carrie Takeyasu (Leadership &
  Management), and Rachel Nicol (Young Woman of Promise) and Lyndsay
  Montina, CCAE Rising Star award (Canadian Council for Advancement of
  Education); and
- New digital sign on University Drive was installed with no cost to the University and will be used for revenue generating. The UofL has veto power on the content:
