Established in 1967, the University of Lethbridge (uLethbridge) is a publicly-funded, comprehensive, academic research institution and proud member of the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada (AUCC).

CALGARY CAMPUS LOCATION







uLethbridge's Calgary Campus is located in the City of Calgary (~200km northwest from the City of Lethbridge where the Lethbridge Campus is based) to which it has been proudly serving both local students as well as the academic community since its inception in 1996. In January 2011, the campus relocated from its original destination at SAIT and subsequently "set-up-shop" inside of Bow Valley College – with whom we share classroom space with and is situated on the eastern end of the Calgary downtown core.

MASTERS OF HEALTH SERVICES MANAGEMENT DEGREE (MHSM)

Jointly offered by uLethbridge's Dhillon School of Business and Faculty of Health Sciences, the MHSM is a **non-Thesis Masters** degree - comprising of 12 courses + a final capstone project, spread across 6 modular semesters - which collectively aim to provide successfully admitted grad students with the (non-clinical) management-based knowledge needed to become effective leaders within the context of the Canadian healthcare system. Some key subject areas that are built into the MHSM include organizational & service design, financial structures, and change management.

GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN HEALTH SERVICES MANAGEMENT (GCHSM)

The GCHSM is a condensed derivative of the MHSM (a "micro-credential") - comprising of 6 courses, spread across 5 modular semesters only (no capstone project) - which students are able to pursue to increase their knowledge base of health services management but are cautious about committing to the formal Masters degree. Successful GCHSM graduates will be able to ladder their completed courses for credit towards the MSHM during the next subsequent intake cycle, if interested.

"BLENDED LEARNING" DELIVERY MODEL

Both the MHSM and the GCHSM are cohort-based, course-based, and part-time only graduate programs which will be fully delivered via blended learning (~30% face-to-face in the City of Calgary + ~70% online), under normal circumstances. A single semester - which is normally 4-months/13-weeks in duration - will typically consist of four (4) synchronous F2F lecture sessions per HMGT-area course (Friday evenings (16:00-21:00 MST/MDT) for one and Saturdays (10:00-15:00 MST/MDT) for the other, where applicable) with everything else in-between taking place asynchronously online. This blended-learning and alternate hours scheduling modality was designed to provide admitted students with the opportunity to balance their uLethbridge graduate studies at their own semi self-directed pace (week-by-week) in concurrence with any daytime work obligations. The average MHSM/GCHSM grad student workload is ~15-18 hours a week (contingent on individual reading speed, study skills, etc.).

**Note: Due to their part-time + blended-learning structures, all international prospects must be aware that they will NOT be eligible to apply for a Post-Graduation Work Permit (PGWP) after GCHSM/MHSM program completion, at this time.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Masters/MHSM (1-of-3 Possible Admission Routes)

- 1. (General/Non-ULETH) Baccalaureate Degree Admission Route
 - An academic undergraduate degree (i.e. a Bachelors) or its equivalent (at a minimum) in Management, Health, or closely related disciplines from a recognized degree-granting institution, with a min. CGPA of 3.00 when translated against uLethbridge's 4.00 scale on the last 20 graded university-level term courses (60.0 credit hours); OR, calculated on all courses completed within the most recently awarded Masters, if applicant possesses one graduate degree already.
 - i. Baccalaureates in non-Management or non-Health disciplines will be considered on a case-by-case basis
 - ii. Int'l Post-Secondary School Requirements for Master's-level Program Admission (sorted alphabetically by country)
 - <u>Evidence of successful work experience in the health sector</u> clinical, corporate, or some combination thereof is normally required. Ideally, 2+ years
 - i. MHSM applicants with between only 1-2 years of health sector work experience at the time of application <u>MAY</u> be reconsidered for GCHSM admittance in lieu (not guaranteed; case-by-case basis)
 - Documented proof of demonstrating sufficient <u>English Language Proficiency (ELP) for Graduate Studies</u>, as detailed <u>here</u>
 - i. <u>Individual ELP Exempt Int'l Universities</u> (sorted alphabetically by country)
 - ii. *NOTE: Highly-qualified applicants who previously completed a fully English-instructed post-secondary program from a non-ULETH recognized ELP exempt school or country MAY be issued conditional admission, pending ELP (case-by-case)
 - Such applicants are to also possess either <u>English-written transcripts</u> or if not, at least <u>an accompanying</u>
 <u>notarized English translation</u> to include in application package in order to merit conditional consideration
- 2. uLethbridge BMgt/BHSc Combined Degree Admission Route
 - A <u>uLethbridge-awarded BMgt/BHSc combined degree</u> with a <u>min. CGPA of 3.00</u> on the <u>last 20</u> graded courses
 - Formal work experience in the health sector would be an asset, however it will not be required for BMgt/BHSc degree-holders
- 3. uLethbridge Post-GCHSM laddering Admission Route
 - A <u>uLethbridge-awarded GCHSM</u> with a <u>min. graduating CGPA of 3.00</u>

Graduate Certificate/GCHSM (1-of-2 Possible Admission Routes)

- 1. (General/Non-ULETH) Baccalaureate Degree Admission Route Same as MHSM credential (see above)
- 2. uLethbridge BMgt/BHSc Combined Degree Admission Route Same as MHSM credential (see above)

*SPECIAL NOTE: Applicants who have significant work and/or life experience but do not sufficiently meet the established competitive GPA admission requirements, MAY still be eligible for admission on an individual case-by-case basis (not guaranteed).

*IMPORTANT: The University reserves the right to determine the acceptable equivalencies of any graduate applicant's presented credentials, associated disciplines, and/or proof of ELP both including and beyond what is displayed above.

SUPPORTING DOCS (Link) | Application Procedure FAQs (Link)

- **Unofficial Academic Transcripts:** Uploaded and scanned copies of each post-secondary institution previously attended and/or currently attending, where applicable.
 - o Non-English transcripts must also be accompanied with a notarized English Translation within application package
- 3 References (*IDEALLY*: 1 university-level instructor + 2 employers in a supervisory capacity): The names and professional emails of those who can speak to applicant's background preparation, suitability, and aptitude for graduate-level studies.
 - Differing combinations and/or types of references will be accepted however, this course of action must be explicitly mentioned and appropriately justified within the applicant's Letter of Intent
 - E.g.) 3 instructors, 3 employers, project managers, research leads, contract principals, professional colleagues, etc.
 - o <u>Unacceptable references include</u>: (1) those submitted by email or regular letter mail, (2) re-used ones in support of a past uLethbridge graduate application, and (3) ones drafted by friends/family members
- **Curriculum Vitae (CV):** Resume of qualifications (i.e. academic background, work/volunteer experience, attended conferences, awards, scholarships, publications, etc.)
- Letter of Intent (Maximum Length: 500 words): Detailing nature of interest in program and intended career outcome(s) upon graduation
 LOI must be addressed to the "Health Services Management Program Committee"
 - **Proof of ELP for Grad Students** (see *Admission Requirements* section above)

MASTERS DEGREE (MHSM) PROGRAM STRUCTURE (~24 MONTHS, MIN.)

The MHSM will consist of 36.0 credit hours of part-time study which will be divided into *five distinct learning modules/terms* + *a final capstone course*. Experiential learning components (e.g. guest speakers, cases, field trips, job shadows etc.) will be additionally incorporated as part of one course within each of the MHSM's five modular program components.

*The IEP should ideally be <u>started</u> at the <u>beginning of Year 2</u> (i.e. during Module IV) and subsequently completed/submitted by the deadline provided by the HSM Program Office, at that time

Experience Project (IEP), will be a written paper which incorporates research engagement (theoretical, empirical, or applied) as a means of <u>identifying and addressing a health organization-based challenge or opportunity of the student's choosing</u>, complete with an implementation plan and applicable metrics for assessing the quality of the proposed solution. The synthesized deliverable must relate to the practice of HSM as well as sufficiently demonstrate the student's critical thinking, conceptual learning, and integrated disciplinary knowledge, as taught across all program courses, in a contextually meaningful way. The overall structure of the IEP will be flexible in order to accommodate the individual grad student's self-determined pursuits for project completion and can be work-based.

GRADUATE CERTIFICATE (<u>GCHSM</u>) PROGRAM STRUCTURE (~20 MONTHS, MIN.)

The <u>GCHSM</u> will consist of <u>15.0 credit hours of part-time study</u> which will be divided into five (5) distinct learning modules. At this time, there will neither be any experiential learning components nor a final capstone project required for GCHSM graduation purposes.
