4. CHANCELLOR'S REMARKS

C. Weaselhead sent his regrets.

- Indigenous Awareness week begins with a smudge at 10:30 on Monday. M. Mahon encouraged Senators to attend.
- The Chancellor will attend Blue and Gold Pronghorn Athletics Award night next week.

5. PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

M. Mahon Reported on

- Labour Relations Very difficult labour stoppage which lasted 6 weeks. We were
 able to get a report accepted by both the Board and ULFA after entering mediation;
 The Mediator Report was accepted March 21st; Revised dates of Spring 2022 to be
 extended to May 4th so we will get both summer sessions in. We are entering into the
 "Engagement" phase with much work to be done with Faculty, Staff, Students and
 Administration to come together and move forward.
- Spring Convocation An announcement is forthcoming but June 1, 2, 3 will see in person ceremonies and past grads from the pandemic to be invited to a ceremony on June 1st. We are excited to be able to see the students cross the stage again. It is an important time for the Senate to volunteer. There has never been a more important time for us to celebrate with coming out of the pandemic and the labor action.
- Provincial Budget fourth and last year of reductions (-5.5% in reductions). We have undertaken a lot of work to get to a balanced budget. There is more money available for creating student opportunities such as work-integrated-learning.
- Presidential Search the committee has resumed their activities; Please check the webpage for up-to-date info
- Return to Campus Update classes resumed online; mask mandate in effect until end of Spring 2022 semester, continue to promote vaccinations strongly.
- Pronghorn Swim Team USports Championship our students won 5 medals and 2 new records; Apollo Hess, Can West swimmer of the week and at nationals was Rookie of the Year. Nationals for track and field are in St John New Brunswick and we have some students there.
- National Co-op Award Lionel Migrino has won a national work-integrated learning award after his efforts through a co-operative education work placement led to tangible change at a major Alberta employer. Migrino, an undergraduate student studying Human Resources Management and Labour Relations in the Dhillon School of Business on the Calgary campus, entered Pembina Pipeline Corporation dividing his time between multiple teams, including the Equity, Diversity and Inclusion team. M. Mahon commented that this is a wonderful recognition for one of our students.
- Congrats to Master of Music Student Sonny Ray Day Rider featured composer in online series with Tom Jackson (former Honorary Degree Recipient) and Calgary Philharmonic supervised under Arlan Schultz, Chair of the Music Department.

There was uncertainty and criticism during the job action in the SU's stance during the strike. M. Mahon addressed this in praising the ULSU and the GSA executives in that they gave excellent student support and he is very proud of the work that they did in advocating for the students. The work of those two groups was key in the return-to-work discussions.

The logo on his shirt was done by Joshua Wong who is a UofL student. Logan was accepted at the UofL and had turned down many other institutions. He was firm in his decision to attend the UofL and was preparing for his path forward. The Boulet Family spends a lot of time and energy from to promote organ and tissue donation. They appreciate what the UofL has done for their family and continues to do for them. M. Mahon thanked T. Boulet for sharing their story and for all of the contributions made by the Boulets to our university community. J. Gallais will be sending out an email regarding green shirt day and what Senators can do to participate.
