

Magazine Article Use Policy

What authors need to know about their submission.

1. All articles submitted to A Light on Teaching magazine will remain the intellectual property of the author.
2. ALL submitted articles will be subject to the following Creative Commons licensing: Creative Common License [Attribution-NonCommercial-NoDerivatives 4.0 International](https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nc-nd/4.0/)
3. The call for articles for the magazine is a competition and submitting your article does not guarantee publication.

Authors who wish to republish their article in print:

1. will not republish their article until 2 weeks from the release date of the issue of A Light on Teaching Magazine.
2. Inform the other publisher that the work has already been published in A Light on Teaching magazine.
 - a. Must have the article published with a CC NC ND license.
 - b. Must place a preceding comment before the article stating that the article was previously published.
 - Example: *A Teaching Journey by* Dr. Firstname Lastname was originally published in the 2016-17 Issue of *A Light on Teaching* magazine. <https://www.ulethbridge.ca/teachingcentre/teaching-centre-magazine>

Authors who wish to republish their article digitally:

1. will not republish their article until 2 weeks from the release date of the issue of *A Light on Teaching Magazine*.
2. Inform the other publisher that the work has already been published in *A Light on Teaching magazine*.
3. Republished articles will use the exact published text from *A Light on Teaching magazine*, and not the original submitted manuscript. This will include all references, footnotes and bibliographic material. This will ensure that all copy edits of the final article are included. Copy-edited manuscripts will be provided to the authors upon request.
4. Must have other publishers apply a CC NC ND license to the republished article
5. Must place a preceding comment before the article stating that the article was previously published.
 - a. Example: *A Teaching Journey* by Dr. Firstname Lastname was originally published in the 2016-17 Issue of *A Light on Teaching* magazine. *A Light on Teaching* magazine is an annual publication focusing on teaching in higher education at the University of Lethbridge produced by the Teaching Centre.
 - b. The issue number and title of the magazine must link back to the full issue of *A Light on Teaching* magazine.

Other publications that wish to republish an article from *A Light on Teaching*

1. permission to republish the article must be received in writing or via email so there is a record of permission. Permission must be received from the Teaching Centre as well as the author of the article.
2. The article must be republished:
 - a. using the full text as published in *A Light on Teaching* magazine including references and footnotes
 - b. OR a 2 paragraph excerpt can be used, and must be linked back to the full article published by the Teaching Centre
 - c. The following must accompany the article if you chose choice a or choice b: *The Title of the Article* by Dr. Firstname Lastname was originally published in the 2016-17(use relevant issue) Issue of *A Light on Teaching* magazine. *A Light on Teaching* magazine is an annual publication focusing on teaching in higher education at the University of Lethbridge produced by the Teaching Centre. You can read the full issue here.
 - i. For those who wish to publish digitally, it is required that you link the last sentence back to the originally published digital output by the Teaching Centre.
3. Except for graphs and figures, relevant to the article, the photos and graphics used to originally publish the article in *A Light on Teaching* cannot be used.

4. A Light on Teaching magazine adheres to the Creative Common License [Attribution-NonCommercial-NoDerivatives 4.0 International](#). You must adhere to the attributes of this license if you wish to republish the articles from the magazine.

Articles that were already published in other journals or magazines.

1. We will not accept any articles published in other publications that do not adhere to the same Creative Commons licensing as our magazine. Creative Common License [Attribution-NonCommercial-NoDerivatives 4.0 International](#). Any attributions that go beyond the licensing of CC NC ND 4.0 International must be submitted during the call for articles.
2. We will not accept any articles presently in completion to be published elsewhere as they may not adhere to our Creative Commons licensing.
