# Playwright's Note

In Tongues came about in a transitional time in my life. I was preparing to move to the US to be with my fiancée when the opportunity came along to develop a play with the students of New Play Workshop here at the University of Lethbridge. It was around that time that a good friend of mine passed away suddenly. Unsurprisingly, the play quickly became a mix of ideas about grief, love and the terror of facing change. I'm always trying to fit my life into a legible story and when things change abruptly, I often find myself asking, "why". What happens when you need answers in order to move on, but those answers are absent? What if you can't handle the answers you're looking for? Does this have anything to do with why we're seemingly all obsessed with true crime media? During the writing of this play a friend said, "knowing why is for chumps." It turned out to be good advice. Some of the characters in this play might be chumps but try to not to judge them too harshly.

## **Development History**

This play was initially developed in 2018 at the University of Lethbridge with the students of Drama 2765 (New Play Workshop), facilitated by Professor Gail Hanrahan. Trevor Rueger with Alberta Playwrights Network supported this process with dramaturgy, concluding with a public reading of an early draft in April 2018. In 2019, the play had two successive workshops with Steel River Playhouse in Pennsylvania, assisted by dramaturg Megan Schumacher. Revisions leading up to the canceled 2020 production had dramaturgical assistance by director Ron Chambers.

## **Director's Note**

I am beyond excited that **In Tongues** is finally making its world premiere after initially being fully rehearsed and ready to go, only to be shut down by the Covid pandemic. This production has been a long time coming, and it's an absolute privilege to see it come to life.

It's also amazing to be back at the University of Lethbridge in a new capacity, directing a show written by fellow alumni, James Odin Wade. Directing this play and working with such wonderful young talents has been an incredible gift, and I'm thrilled to share our new completed vision with you.

As we bring **In Tongues** to the stage, the vision was to create an immersive experience. By placing the audience mere meters from the performers, the intention was to intensify the emotional impact and fully draw you into the world of these characters. This intimate setting allows the raw emotions and actions to envelop you, offering a deeply engaging and powerful experience.

### **BIOS For Returning Alumni Artists**



James Odin Wade (BFA'11) is a writer based in Calgary, Alberta. As a playwright, he has presented work with Lunchbox Theatre, The Citadel Theatre, Workshop West, Theatre Calgary, The Road Theater Company, and many others. His work has garnered awards from Canada and the US including The Alberta Playwriting Competition (Helmut's Big Day), The National One–Act Playwriting Competition (In Case of Fire), and the Tennessee Williams Literary Festival's One–Act Play Contest (By the Book). This year he was awarded the Lieutenant Governor of Alberta's Emerging Artist Award. He holds a BFA from the University of Lethbridge and an MFA from the University of Calgary. Anastasia Siceac (BFA'20) is a graduate of the University of Lethbridge with a BFA in Dramatic Arts. She began her drama studies in Europe before moving to Lethbridge in 2016 to complete her education and collaborate with many incredible local artists.



Anastasia has had the opportunity to act, direct, and stage manage numerous shows within the Lethbridge theatre community and worked with a variety of local theatre companies, including Theatre Outré, Hootenanny, New West Theatre, and Shakespeare in the Park. Her passions include theatre, collaborative creation, dance, film, and clowning. Last year, Anastasia co-directed TomorrowLove as part of the Department of Drama Mainstage series and is thrilled to be back directing In Tongues. She currently works as New West Theatre's Education Coordinator, where she loves watching young talents grow and helping them discover the magic of theatre. Anastasia is also known around Lethbridge community events for her performances as Lola the Clown.



Amanda Epp (BFA'20) is thrilled to be back working on In Tongues here at the University of Lethbridge. In September 2005 he moved to England for a year earning an Audio Engineering Diploma and Pro Tools Operator certification from Alchemea College in London. This spring Kelly was thrilled to be the Instructor for Drama 3850 Applied Sound Design and Production, and Sound Designer for the Drama production of Jesus Christ Superstar in March.



**Brent Clark** (BFA'20) is a University of Lethbridge alumnus, holding a BFA in Dramatic Arts since 2020.

The General Manager of Theatre Outré, Brent's work in both theatre and film includes acting/fight choreography for Scavenger (2021) and The Play That Goes Wrong (2023), and intimacy choreography for Next to Normal (2022), Elf: The Musical (2023) and alterNatives (2024). Passionate about safety in performance, Brent has acquired a PAL firearms license to further promote the safe handling of mock firearms on stage.

Brent also serves as an Instructional Assistant within Lethbridge Polytechnic, where they assist in training police cadets from various precincts, including Lethbridge, Taber, Medicine Hat, and Manitoba Blood Tribe.
