Community rallies around student support, sets new mark for Buy A Student A Breakfast campaign

University of Lethbridge alumni, employees and community supporters answered the call on Giving Tuesday, supporting the annual Buy A Student A Breakfast campaign in record fashion. The final tally resulted in \$9,365 raised and 1,560 breakfast coupons purchased for ULethbridge students as they head into their final exams.

"Thanks to your incredible generosity, our students are starting this exam season with the nourishment and support they need to succeed," says Cyndi Crane (BMus '95, MEd '01), University of Lethbridge Alumni Association president. "Beyond a warm meal, your support delivers an even greater gift — a reminder to students that their community is behind them, rooting for their success. In addition to community support, ULethbridge's food service provider, Chartwells, donated a percentage of the breakfast cost to the campaign.
