Students selecting Thesis route complete 4 **core** courses, a minimum of 4 other courses and EDUC 6040 Thesis. Students selecting Project/Thesis may opt to complete courses required beyond minimum requirements; additional course fees are assessed. Students completing a Project or Thesis typically require additional terms to complete program.
