

Committees

Health and Wellness

Promotes mental and physical well-being through various events such as intramurals, ice skating, self-care nights, etc.

Cabaret

This committee plans and organizes the cab events for the year which changes from year to year but is normally 3-4 cabarets in the SU Ballrooms and Winter Formal in the fall which is planned alongside the President

Communication

Working under the communications manager this committee does all the social media and "marketing" for ORS

Committees

Residence Wars

Plans events that are both active and passive against other sections (through friendly competitions) in the hopes of winning the trophy

Community Involvement

Providing volunteer opportunities within the campus community and the city at large

Facilities

Updating and changing out old items such as end of pool cues, white board markers in study rooms as well as overseeing large storage rooms with various items.

Maintaining & Protecting Community-RAD Shifts

On call support to students:

- Lock outs
- Maintenance concerns
- Roommate conflicts
- Noise complaintsMental health responseempathetic/activelistening

Rounds:

- Check facility common spaces
- Ensure quiet hours are respected
- Note handbook violations
- Interact with residents

Crisis Response:

- First responder to emergencies
- Activate support services (CLOC, another RA, Security, EMS, Police, etc.)



Maintaining & Protecting Community-Community Standards

- Model the values of, and ensure residents are following, the residence community handbook and other university policies
- Refer students to resources such as Counselling Services, Health Centre, Campus Collective Center, Students' Union, Iikaisskini: Indigenous Student Centre, etc.
- Identify and respond to potential safety and/or security issues
- Create a safe, warm, and welcoming environment for residents

















- Part of the RA compensation is a dining plan which is purchased by Housing and Chartwells
- The purpose of the dining plan is for you to be a part of DPAC
- The ORS team gets split into two groups each semester:
- One group attends DPAC meetings once a month where you advocate on behalf of your residents
- Another group fills out one short survey a month to gather feedback from the rest of the team








Self-Care & Being a Good RA

- You will still have time to focus on yourself and your needs




Frequently Asked Questions



 Yes, there are many examples of students who had meetings with Housing and were hired as an RA the next year

 In some cases, students who show personal growth after a Housing meeting are encouraged to apply

Can I go home on the weekends?

 It is expected that RAs be a presence on their floors during the week & weekends, with freedom to come and go as needed

- Most of resident's extracurricular socializing, Residence War events, Cabarets, and possible incidents may occur during weekends and thus an RA presence during these times is important
- RA partners monitor floors together and usually figure out who will be around each weekend so that at least one of them will be present
- RAD (Residence Assistant on Duty) overnight on-call shifts that will require at least one weekend shift per RA per month (on average)

Operations Team

Business Manager- *finance focused*

- •Responsible for the supervision and management of ORS' financial assets and practices
 - This includes budgeting, expense approvals, bookkeeping and reporting

Communications Manager- digital design and communication focused

- •Responsible for the maintenance and management of ORS' diverse communications offerings
 - This includes social media, event photos, videos, posters, promotions, etc.

Peer Education Programmer (PEP) - academic and wellness focused

•Responsible for developing, promoting, and executing professional and peer-to-peer strategic programming and initiatives that will take place in residence (I.e., Student Success 101, Peer Mentor Program, etc.)

Facilities Manager- facilities focused

- •Responsible for the maintenance and supervision of the common spaces and the equipment.
 - This includes fixing pool cues, adding white board markers, setting up the Christmas lights, organizing storage spaces and helping with larger facility purchases (e.g. gym equipment)
