



Description

Co-op work term placements must accommodate all public health measures that are in place for the region where the work term will take place and for the proposed duration. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, a high level of uncertainty about job prospects is to be anticipated, and working from home may be required. Local health guidelines and guidance will dictate the nature of the work. Students are expected to adhere to all COVID-19 rules and recommendations put in place by Alberta Health and the workplace. Full Covid-19 vaccination is a condition of employment with the Government of Canada.

We are seeking one (or two) co-op student(s) to participate in our research projects. One current project examines the effect of different nitrogen amendment technologies on GHG emissions from Spring Wheat cropping under dryland (rain fed) and irrigated conditions. Another project will focus on nutrient management practices and how they can contribute to the development of metrics and indicators for on-farm accumulation of carbon and reduction in GHG emissions.

The student(s) in this position will learn about general agriculture and soil science while assisting with projects involving soil, crop, and greenhouse gas sampling, sample processing, and sample analysis. The ideal candidate(s) will have an interest in both field and laboratory work. Winter season work will be underway which includes preparing gas sampling vials, preparing soil and crop samples, analyzing samples for various physical or chemical properties, and preparing equipment for the upcoming field season. Duties will shift more from inside work to field and sampling work as the growing season approaches. Tasks for all projects also include entering data and performing simple calculations and other duties as needed.






