University of Lethbridge Library holds Pincher Creek Echo Digitized Collection Launch Party

A unique partnership between the <u>Kootenai Brown Pioneer Village</u> and the <u>University of Lethbridge Library</u> Digitization Team has resulted in a monumental achievement. More than 120 years of Pincher Creek history is now available in an accessible digitized collection of the Pincher Creek Echo newspaper.
