Student researchers in the spotlight at final stage of Three Minute Thesis competition

The 10 finalists have been identified and now it's time to determine the winners of the annual Three Minute Thesis (3MT®) competition.

Three Minute Thesis is a research communication competition developed by The University of Queensland that challenges higher degree students to present a compelling oration on their research thesis and its significance in just three minutes in language appropriate to a non-specialist audience. Its aim is to hone young researchers' skills in knowledge translation.

Some of the topics being discussed by the finalists include brain function, plant conservation, cattle health and forest fire modeling.
