DRAMA PRACTICUM COURSE GUIDELINES

Updated August 2025

- 1. Only productions approved by the Department of Drama may be used for practicum course credit.
- 2. Assignment of performance roles is based on an audition and applicable for credit in Drama 2600, 3600, and 4600 courses.
- 3. Students must have completed a minimum of 15 university courses including DRAM 2600 prior to enrolling in DRAM 3600; and have completed a minimum of 15 university courses including DRAM 3600 prior to enrolling in DRAM 4600.
- 4. Assignment of other creative roles is based on production needs and approval by appropriate faculty member.
- 5. All practicum course forms must be completed and signed by the student and faculty supervisor by the end of the first week of rehearsal. Late paperwork will not be accepted.
- 6. Upon receiving notification and all relevant information from supervising faculty, Fine Arts Student Program Services will register the student in the appropriate practicum course. Registration for practicum courses will usually occur during the term the production or assignment takes place, but in cases where the notification is received after November 15 in a Fall term or March 15 in a Winter term, the course will be registered in the following spring or fall term, respectively.
- 7. Students are encouraged to register for a maximum of one practicum course per term and generally are not permitted to work on a production in more than one capacity.
- 8. Practicum course hours usually increase with practicum course level, however, practicum course hours are variable based on the role or position assigned and needs of the production or project. Practicum course grades are based on successful completion of the project and not associated with any number of completed hours.
- 9. Students may be required to work or rehearse during holidays and reading breaks. It is the student's responsibility to attain the production and rehearsal schedules and ensure that they are able to fulfill all of the responsibilities of the position including work or rehearsal during holidays and reading breaks. Refusal or inability to meet the demands of the project will result in removal from the position and/or a failing course grade.
- 10. Combined drama education degree students may not register for any drama practicum course while in Professional Semester II (PS II) or Professional Semester III (PS III) due to education degree regulations and field placement scheduling conflicts.
- 11. Final course grade determined in accordance with the grading scale adopted by the Department of Drama and supervising faculty.
