APPENDIX E: INTERNATIONAL INTERNSHIP PLACEMENT CRITERIA ADCS 3050 and/or 4050: INTERNSHIP IN ADDICTIONS COUNSELLING INTERNATIONAL INTERNSHIP PLACEMENT CRITERIA

Students will be considered for an international internship placement subject to the following:

- A. Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
- B. Letter of Intent written by the student, outlining:
- a) why the student is interested in this experience,
- b) any previous experience (special skills, previous international travel),
- c) how this experience will be of benefit to the student,
- d) an understanding of international/cultural issues related to the specific program of study.
- C. 3 letters of reference, 2 of which reflect clinical skill sets (i.e. preceptors, supervisors, employers, faculty)
- D. Interview with Internship Coordinator and Faculty Liaison/Course Instructor The interview may include assessment and discussion of:
- academic role of student
- strong group work skills
- strong interpersonal skills
- self-care skills
- health care issues
- cultural issues
- criminal record history
- addictions, recovery, and mental health issues
- E. Evidence of Strong Clinical Skills (please email Michaela Schultchen (Thompson) and give her consent to send the Internship coordinator your grades for the following courses and current overall GPA:
- minimum GPA of 3.0 in all clinical counseling courses (ADCS 1020; ADCS 1220; ADCS 2120; ADCS 3120, ADCS 3420)
- F. If appropriate, an evaluation from the supervisor for your ADCS 3050 internship.

For all international placement considerations, all documents to be submitted the <u>Internship</u> <u>Coordinator</u> 11 months prior to intended semester of placement.
