### PUBlic Professor Series — Prehistoric Bison Hunters in Southern Alberta Thursday, Feb. 25, 7 to 9 p.m., City Hall, 910 4 Ave. S.

Dr. Shawn Bubel, a U of L archaeology and geography professor, will talk about the artifacts that have been unearthed at the Fincastle site south of the Oldman River. Along with projectile points, stone tools and bison bone fragments, a number of ceremonial bone upright features were uncovered. The site also shows a strong cultural connection between the Fincastle hunters and groups living in the Middle Missouri area.
