Department of Philosophy Colloquium Series — Dr. Kent Peacock Friday, Oct. 16, 4 p.m., C640 University Hall

Peacock will talk about the 2015 Paris Climate Conference, to be held Nov. 30 to Dec. 12. The goal of the conference is to arrive at an international agreement to limit global warming to no more than 2 C above pre-industrial levels. He'll argue that the 2 C may not be good enough to prevent catastrophic sea level rise and other extreme consequences. While there are a few reasons for cautious optimism, the climate crisis forces us to look at what it will take for the human species to be willing and able to rationally manage its affairs on a planetary scale.
